

## 102ND GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2021 and 2022 HB3725

Introduced 2/22/2021, by Rep. Tom Demmer

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/48-4.5 new

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that a person commits misrepresentation of a service animal when he or she knowingly represents, expressly or impliedly, that the animal is a service animal for the purpose of securing the rights and privileges afforded to a person with a disability accompanied by a service animal and the person knew or should have known that the animal is not a service animal. Provides that the refusal to answer questions from a law enforcement officer permitted under federal regulation creates a permissive inference that the animal is not a service animal and the law enforcement officer may require the person to remove the animal from the place of public accommodation. Provides that misrepresentation of a service animal is a petty offense. Defines "service animal".

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by adding Section 48-4.5 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/48-4.5 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 48-4.5. Misrepresentation of a service animal.</u>
- (a) In this Section, "service animal" means a dog or 8 9 miniature horse that is trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of a person with a disability, including a 10 physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental 11 12 disability. The work or tasks performed by the animal must be directly related to the person's disability, including, but 13 14 not limited to, assisting a person who is visually impaired with navigation and other tasks, alerting a person who is deaf 15 or hard of hearing to the presence of people or sounds, 16 providing nonviolent protection or rescue work, pulling a 17 wheelchair, assisting a person during a seizure, alerting a 18 19 person to the presence of allergens, retrieving items such as medicine or the telephone, providing physical support and 20 21 assistance with balance and stability to a person with 22 mobility disabilities, or helping a person with psychiatric and neurological disabilities by preventing or interrupting 2.3

- impulsive or disruptive behaviors. Work or tasks do not
  include the animal's presence as a deterrent for criminal
  activity, emotional support, well-being, comfort, or
- 4 <u>companionship.</u>

- (b) A person commits misrepresentation of a service animal when he or she knowingly represents, expressly or impliedly, that the animal is a service animal for the purpose of securing the rights and privileges afforded to a person with a disability accompanied by a service animal and the person knew or should have known that the animal is not a service animal.
- (c) The refusal to answer questions from a law enforcement officer permitted under subsection (f) of 28 CFR 35.136 creates a permissive inference that the animal is not a service animal and the law enforcement officer may require the person to remove the animal from the place of public accommodation.
