1 AN ACT concerning State government.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
- 5 Illinois Commission on Amateur Sports Act.
- Section 5. Illinois Commission on Amateur Sports; purpose;

  duties.
- 8 (a) The Illinois Commission on Amateur Sports is created.
- 9 (b) The purpose of the Commission is to research, study,
- 10 and to make recommendations to the Governor, the General
- 11 Assembly, and the Department of Commerce and Economic
- 12 Opportunity about the promotion, development, expansion,
- 13 hosting, and fostering of amateur sports, amateur sports
- 14 programs, and amateur sporting events and tournaments
- 15 throughout the State.
- 16 (c) Recommendations made by the Commission shall focus
- 17 generally on the promotion and encouragement of physical
- 18 fitness through the participation in amateur sports and
- 19 amateur sports programs and on the development of local and
- 20 statewide business opportunities and economic development
- 21 relating to amateur sports, amateur sports programs,
- 22 competitions, events and tournaments. The recommendations
- 23 reported by the Commission to the Governor, the General

- 1 Assembly, and the Department of Commerce and Economic 2 Opportunity shall include, but are not limited to, the 3 following objectives:
  - (1) To provide workshops, training, and conferences to schools and communities throughout the State to increase youth participation in amateur sports and amateur sports programs.
  - (2) To connect public, private, local, and State entities to generate funding for amateur sports programs and to facilitate the communication of information statewide about amateur sports programs and events.
  - (3) To support the development of and investment in an Olympic Training Center in the State.
  - (4) To promote the participation of community amateur sports programs in national and international amateur athletic competitions and events.
  - (5) To encourage the inclusion and participation of persons with disabilities in amateur sports and amateur sports programs.
  - (6) To encourage the inclusion and participation of persons from historically disadvantaged communities in amateur sports and amateur sports programs.
- 23 (7) To support and encourage the development of sports tourism.

- 1 (a) The Commission shall include the following members:
  - (1) Four members appointed by the Governor who have recognized experience in promoting, organizing, or administering amateur sports programs or other athletic organizations.
    - (2) Two members appointed by the Governor who are Olympians and who participated in youth sports.
    - (3) One member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate.
  - (4) One member of the Senate appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate.
  - (5) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
  - (6) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
  - (7) One member appointed by the Governor who represents an Illinois high school athletic association.
  - (8) One member appointed by the Governor who represents an Illinois collegiate athletic association.
  - (9) One member appointed by the Governor who is a representative of the Illinois Council of Convention and Visitor Bureaus or represents any other similar State-certified entity.
  - (10) Fifteen members appointed by the Governor who shall individually represent one category of the following

amateur youth sports, but shall as a group represent all 1 2 of the following categories of amateur youth sports: (A) Baseball. 3 (B) Basketball. (C) Gymnastics. (D) Cross country running or other track and field 6 7 sports. (E) Football. 8 9 (F) Golf. 10 (G) Hockey. 11 (H) Soccer. 12 (I) Softball. 13 (J) Swimming. (K) Volleyball. 14 15 (L) Cheerleading. 16 (M) Wrestling. 17 (N) Tennis. 18 (O) The Special Olympics. (b) More than 4 members of the General Assembly may be 19 20 appointed to serve on the Commission as long as the number of 21 members appointed at any time, except during a vacancy, 22 represent equally each of the majority and minority caucuses 23 of each house.

The Governor shall select the chairperson of the

Council from among the members.

- 1 Section 15. Terms; meetings; support; expenses.
- 2 (a) Each member of the Commission shall be appointed for a
- 3 2-year term, or until his or her successor is appointed. The
- 4 Governor may stagger the members' terms to ensure continuity
- 5 in the performance of the Commission's responsibilities.
- 6 (b) The Commission shall meet initially within 90 days
- 7 after the effective date of this Act, and at least quarterly
- 8 thereafter, at the times and places in this State that the
- 9 Commission designates.
- 10 (c) The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity
- 11 shall provide administrative and other support to the
- 12 Commission.
- 13 (d) Members of the Commission shall receive no
- 14 compensation for their participation, but may be reimbursed by
- 15 the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
- 16 expenses in connection with their participation, including
- travel, subject to the rules of the appropriate travel control
- 18 board, if funds are available.
- 19 Section 20. Reporting. The Commission shall submit a
- 20 report of its findings, research, and recommendations to the
- 21 Governor, the General Assembly, and the Department of Commerce
- 22 and Economic Opportunity on or before December 31, 2023 and
- each December 31 thereafter.
- 24 Section 25. Repeal. The Commission is dissolved and this

- Act is repealed on January 1, 2026. 1
- 2 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- becoming law. 3
