1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Act is to help
 homeless service providers receive federal resources during
 public health emergencies, including personal protective
 equipment for which the Federal Emergency Management Agency
 has final authority for reimbursement.

 19 providers in the State to be essential critical infrastructure

- qualify for the same priority benefits afforded to frontline 1

(c) In accordance with this Section, during a

- 9 health disaster declared by a proclamation issued by the
