SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the University of Illinois Hospital Act, the Hospital Licensing Act, the Managed Care Reform and Patient Rights Act, the Medical Practice Act of 1987, and the Illinois Public Aid Code. Provides that, notwithstanding any other provision of law, hospitals and physicians organized or licensed under the Acts and health plans and managed care organizations must provide medical facts regarding COVID-19 and vaccines that can be used to protect against COVID-19 to all patients under the care of the hospital, physician, health plan, or managed care organization. Makes conforming changes in the Illinois Insurance Code. Effective immediately.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The University of Illinois Hospital Act is 5 amended by adding Section 8e as follows:

6 (110 ILCS 330/8e new)

Sec. 8e. COVID-19 and vaccine information. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the University of Illinois Hospital must provide medical facts regarding COVID-19 and vaccines that can be used to protect against COVID-19 to all patients under the University of Illinois Hospital's care.

Section 10. The Hospital Licensing Act is amended by adding Section 6.30 as follows:

15 <u>Sec. 6.30. COVID-19 and vaccine information.</u>
16 <u>Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a hospital</u>

Insurance companies that transact the kinds of insurance authorized under Class 1(b) or Class 2(a) of Section 4 of this Code shall comply with Sections <u>15.1</u>, 45, 45.1, 45.2, and 85, subsection (d) of Section 30, and the definition of the term "emergency medical condition" in Section 10 of the Managed Care Reform and Patient Rights Act.
