## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

30 ILCS 500/20-75


#### Abstract

Amends the Illinois Procurement Code. Provides that for any procurement protest for which the resolution of such protest results in the denial or reversal of a solicitation, award, or contract, the purchasing agency shall be limited to no more than 2 extensions of a preexisting expiring contract for the procurement of services that were the subject of the protested solicitation, award, or contract. Provides that the 2 contract extensions shall be for a total of no more than 90 days combined, after which the purchasing agency shall resubmit solicitations for the procurement of services.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly: 

Section 5. The Illinois Procurement Code is amended by changing Section 20-75 as follows:
(30 ILCS 500/20-75)
Sec. 20-75. Disputes and protests.
(a) The chief procurement officers shall by rule establish procedures to be followed in resolving protested solicitations and awards and contract controversies, for debarment or suspension of contractors, and for resolving other procurement-related disputes.
(b) Notwithstanding any rule or provision of law to the contrary, for any procurement protest for which the resolution of such protest results in the denial or reversal of a solicitation, award, or contract, the purchasing agency shall be limited to no more than 2 extensions of a preexisting expiring contract for the procurement of services that were the subject of the protested solicitation, award, or contract. The 2 contract extensions authorized under this subsection (b) shall be for a total of no more than 90 days combined, after which the purchasing agency shall resubmit solicitations for the procurement of services.
