1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
34-222 as follows:

(105 ILCS 5/34-222 new) 6 7 Sec. 34-222. School attendance boundaries. (a) At least once every 5 years, the Department of School 8 9 Demographics and Planning ("DSP") shall evaluate the enrollment at existing schools in the school district to 10 determine if there is a need to revise existing boundaries. 11 12 (1) In reviewing the enrollment at existing schools to determine if there is a need to revise existing 13 14 boundaries, DSP shall consider a range of factors, including the following: 15 16 (A) capacities of the school being reviewed and 17 schools with contiguous boundaries to the school being 18 reviewed; 19 (B) current and projected racial and ethnic composition of the school being reviewed and any 20 21 schools with contiguous boundaries to the school being 22 reviewed; (C) current and projected income level composition 23

of the school being reviewed and any schools with 1 contiguous boundaries to the school being reviewed; 2 3 (D) geographic barriers; (E) travel time and distance to the school; and 4 5 (F) program considerations of the school being reviewed and any schools with contiguous boundaries to 6 7 the school being reviewed. (2) DSP shall submit a written report of its findings, 8 conclusions, and recommendations to the chief executive 9 officer and the Board. The report shall document the 10 11 evaluation of the factors of the school being reviewed. 12 The report shall be made public on the district's website within 30 days after its completion. 13 14 (b) If it is determined that there is a need to revise any existing boundaries, DSP shall develop and recommend any 15 16 proposed changes to the chief executive officer prior to the beginning of the school year in which the changes are to take 17 effect. In addition, DSP shall develop and recommend proposed 18 19 boundaries for new schools to the chief executive officer prior to the beginning of the school year in which the new 20 21 school boundaries are to take effect. 22 (1) In developing proposed changes to boundaries for 23 existing schools and proposing attendance boundaries for 24 new schools, DSP shall consider a range of factors, 25 including the following: 26 (A) DSP shall consider the capacities of each of

1	the schools involved in the proposed boundary
2	revisions, including the extent to which a school is
3	overcrowded or underutilized. Where feasible, the goal
4	is for elementary schools to be utilized at not more
5	than 80% of design capacity and for high schools at not
6	more than 100% of program capacity. Schools shall be
7	considered severely overcrowded if they are operating
8	in excess of 100% utilization and significantly
9	underutilized if they are operating at less than 30%
10	utilization. DSP shall consider these utilization
11	rates when proposing revisions to attendance
12	boundaries for existing schools and when proposing
13	attendance boundaries for new schools.

14(B) DSP shall consider the current and projected15racial and ethnic composition of the schools affected.16Where feasible, DSP shall propose establishing or17revising attendance boundaries to maintain or promote18stably desegregated enrollments in each of the19affected schools and to avoid the creation of one-race20schools.

21 <u>(C) DSP shall consider geographic barriers so as</u> 22 <u>to promote safety and minimize transportation burdens,</u> 23 <u>to the extent feasible.</u>

24 <u>(D) DSP shall consider travel time and distance</u> 25 <u>and, to the extent feasible, seek to minimize travel</u> 26 <u>time and distance.</u> - 4 - LRB102 23396 NLB 32565 b

1 (E) DSP shall consider the placement of programs in each of the schools involved, such as programs for 2 3 English learners and for special education students. In addition, DSP shall consider the impact of magnet 4 5 schools and programs and the requirements of the federal Every Student Succeeds Act and the Illinois 6 7 Balanced Accountability Measures. (2) For each proposed attendance boundary, DSP shall 8 9 develop at least 2 alternatives. For each alternative, DSP 10 shall prepare a report showing 3-year enrollment 11 projections by racial and ethnic groups for all schools 12 affected by the proposed change pursuant to each 13 alternative. The report shall document for each 14 alternative the impact on the affected schools for the factors of capacity, geographic barriers, travel time and 15 distance, and program considerations. In developing 16 alternatives, DSP shall consider whether any feasible 17

21 report shall be made public on the district's website 22 within 30 days after its completion. 23 (c) The chief executive officer shall review the report 24 from DSP and may suggest additional alternatives. The chief 25 executive officer shall report to the Board if he or she 26 recommends any changes to existing boundaries or establishing

boundaries for new schools. If the chief executive officer is 1 2 recommending any changes to existing boundaries or 3 establishing any boundaries for new schools, the chief executive officer shall provide the Board with a report of the 4 5 alternatives considered, including data on the factors of capacity, current and projected racial and ethnic 6 7 considerations, geographic barriers, travel time and distance, and program considerations. The chief executive officer shall 8 9 inform the Board of the alternative that is being recommended. 10 The report shall be made public on the district's website 11 within 30 days after its completion.

12 (d) Prior to taking action on the establishment or revision of any attendance boundaries, the Board shall conduct 13 14 public hearings on the proposed establishment or revision of attendance boundaries and the chief executive officer's 15 16 recommendation. Prior to the public hearing, the Board shall 17 make available reports and data on the factors of capacity, current and projected racial and ethnic considerations, 18 19 geographic barriers, travel time and distance, and program 20 considerations. In making its decision, the Board shall 21 consider the factors of capacity, current and projected racial and ethnic considerations, geographic barriers, travel time 22 23 and distance, and program considerations.
