## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Insurance Code is amended by adding Section 388h as follows:
- 6 (215 ILCS 5/388h new)
- 7 Sec. 388h. Opioid antagonists; Liquor Control Act of 1934.
- 8 An insurer may not increase the amount of an insured's premium
- 9 based on the insured's compliance with Section 6-39 of the
- 10 Liquor Control Act of 1934.
- 11 Section 10. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by
- 12 adding Section 6-39 as follows:
- 13 (235 ILCS 5/6-39 new)
- Sec. 6-39. Opioid antagonists on premises.
- 15 <u>(a) In this Section, "music venue" means an indoor or</u>
- outdoor location with a capacity of more than 800 persons used
- as a space to hold a live concert or musical performance.
- 18 (b) If a licensee operates as a music venue, the licensee
- 19 shall ensure that, during its hours of operation as a music
- venue, it has opioid antagonists available at the premises and
- 21 <u>that there is a staff member on the premises who has been</u>

- sufficiently trained on how to properly administer an opioid 1
- antagonist. A person who has been certified in the 2
- administration of opioid antagonists by a governmental or 3
- 4 private entity, regardless of when the person received that
- 5 certification, is deemed to be sufficiently trained under this
- 6 Section.
- 7 (c) Any person who is sufficiently trained and in good
- 8 faith administers or provides an opioid antagonist in
- 9 accordance with this Section, shall not, as a result of his or
- her acts or omissions, except willful or wanton misconduct on 10
- 11 the part of the person, in administering or providing the
- 12 opioid antagonist, be liable for civil damages.
- 13 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect June 1,
