## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

325 ILCS 5/7.2

from Ch. 23, par. 2057.2

Amends the Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act. Provides that notwithstanding any other law or rule to the contrary, whenever a child protective investigator of a Child Protective Service Unit must visit a home or residence to investigate a report of abuse or neglect, at least one local law enforcement officer must accompany the child protective investigator to offer assistance and must remain with the child protective investigator for the duration of the visit until the child protective investigator is safely clear of the home or residence.

AN ACT concerning children.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Abused and Neglected Child Reporting Act is
amended by changing Section 7.2 as follows:

6 (325 ILCS 5/7.2) (from Ch. 23, par. 2057.2)

7 Sec. 7.2. The Department shall establish а Child Protective Service Unit within each geographic region as 8 9 designated by the Director of the Department. The Child Protective Service Unit shall perform those functions assigned 10 by this Act to it and only such others that would further the 11 purposes of this Act. It shall have a sufficient staff of 12 13 qualified personnel to fulfill the purpose of this Act and be 14 organized in such a way as to maximize the continuity of responsibility, care and service of the individual workers 15 16 toward the individual children and families.

The Child Protective Service Unit shall designate members of each unit to receive specialty training to serve as special consultants to unit staff and the public in the areas of child sexual abuse, child deaths and injuries, and out-of-home investigations.

Service Unit must visit a home or residence to investigate a 1 2 report of abuse or neglect, at least one local law enforcement 3 officer must accompany the child protective investigator to offer assistance and must remain with the child protective 4 5 investigator for the duration of the visit until the child protective investigator is safely clear of the home or 6 7 residence. If a child protective investigator of a Child Protective Service Unit is unable to obtain assistance 8 from 9 other unit members when responding to a high risk report of 10 child abuse or neglect and the child protective investigator 11 has a reasonable belief or suspicion that a subject named in 12 the report has the potential for violence, the child protective investigator may request assistance from local law 13 enforcement officers to be provided at a mutually available 14 time. Law enforcement officers shall, upon request, make all 15 reasonable efforts to assist the child protective investigator 16 17 in receiving law enforcement assistance from any other police jurisdiction that is outside the accompanying officers' 18 primary jurisdiction. 19
