- 2 WHEREAS, The State of Illinois needs a reasonable, 3 deliberate, and measured plan for administering vaccinations 4 for COVID-19; and
- 5 WHEREAS, It is essential that vaccinations be administered 6 fairly in each county in the State, under the same guidelines, 7 and equitable to each region and population in the State; and
 - WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), nationwide, as of January 26, 2021, 5.8% of the population has received 1 out of the 2 doses necessary for full protection from current COVID-19 vaccines; 1% of the population has received 2 out of the 2 doses necessary for full protection from current COVID-19 vaccines; 41,418,325 doses of the vaccine have been distributed, and 22,734,243 vaccinations have been given; and
- WHEREAS, According to the CDC, in Illinois as of January 16 26, 2021, 4.6% of the population has received 1 out of the 2 17 18 doses necessary for full protection from current COVID-19 vaccines; 1.1% of the population has received 2 out of the 2 19 doses necessary for full protection from current COVID-19 20 21 vaccines; 1,417,250 doses of the vaccine have 22 distributed, and 723,203 vaccinations have been given; and

- 1 WHEREAS, According to the Illinois Department of Public
- 2 Health, in Illinois as of January 26, 2021, 550,050 doses of
- 3 COVID-19 vaccine have been allocated to long-term care
- 4 facilities, and 110,403 doses have been administered in
- 5 long-term care facilities; therefore, be it
- 6 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE
- 7 HUNDRED SECOND GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that
- 8 the current state of the vaccination program is not
- 9 satisfactory; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That we urge the vaccination plan be made fully
- 11 transparent and readily accessible to the public; and be it
- 12 further
- 13 RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be
- 14 delivered to all Illinois constitutional officers, the
- 15 Director of the Illinois Department of Public Health, the
- 16 Director of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency, the
- 17 Speaker and Minority Leader of the Illinois House of
- 18 Representatives, and the President and Minority Leader of the
- 19 Illinois Senate.
