HOUSE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is a progressive nervous 3 system disorder that affects movement; symptoms start 4 gradually, sometimes starting with a barely noticeable tremor 5 in just one hand; additional symptoms may include slowed 6 movement, rigid muscles, impaired posture and balance, loss of 7 automatic movements, speech changes, and writing changes; and

8 WHEREAS, The signs and symptoms of Parkinson's disease can 9 be different for everyone; early signs may be mild and go 10 unnoticed; and

11 WHEREAS, The cause of Parkinson's disease is unknown, and 12 therefore, proven ways to prevent the disease also remain a 13 mystery; and

14 WHEREAS, Approximately 50,000 Americans are diagnosed with 15 Parkinson's disease each year, and an estimated one millions 16 people in the U.S. and 7 to 10 million people worldwide are 17 living with the disease; and

18 WHEREAS, Although Parkinson's disease cannot be cured, 19 medications might significantly improve one's symptoms; early 20 detection is key; therefore, be it HR0783 -2- LRB102 27000 MST 38250 r
