1	AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 658
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 658 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Emergency Telephone System Act is amended
5	by changing Section 3 as follows:
6	(50 ILCS 750/3) (from Ch. 134, par. 33)
7	(Section scheduled to be repealed on December 31, 2023)
8	Sec. 3. (a) By July 1, 2017, every local public agency
9	shall be within the jurisdiction of a 9-1-1 system.
10	(b) Within 18 months of the awarding of a contract to a
11	vendor certified under Section 13-900 of the Public Utilities
12	Act to provide Next Generation 9-1-1 service, every 9-1-1
13	system in Illinois, except in a municipality with a population
14	over 500,000, shall provide Next Generation 9-1-1 service. A
15	municipality with a population over 500,000 shall provide Next
16	Generation 9-1-1 service by December 31, 2023.

Notwithstanding any provision of the Illinois Municipal Code, a 9-1-1 vendor under Section 13-900 of the Public Utilities Act must give written notice to the municipality it has a contract with or for which it currently provides emergency services not less than 12 months prior to termination of services. If an emergency services contract is terminated, the provider may not increase the fees of any

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remaining contract by more than 3% of the fees from the 8 previous year. A private sector company that terminates the 9 10 emergency services contract prior to the natural expiration of 11 the contract term and that seeks an increase in the annual contract value of more than 10% is barred from contracting 12 13 with any units of local government or entities that receive 14 funding for emergency services for a period of 5 years from the 15 date of the notice of contract termination. As used in this paragraph, "emergency services" includes, but is not limited 16 to, dispatch, 9-1-1, paramedic, or ambulance services. 17

(c) Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit or
discourage in any way the formation of multijurisdictional or
regional systems, and any system established pursuant to this
Act may include the territory of more than one public agency or
may include a segment of the territory of a public agency.

24 Section 10. The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Systems 25 Act is amended by adding Section 3.260 as follows: 10200SB0658ham001

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(210 ILCS 50/3.260 new)

2 Sec. 3.260. Contracts with municipalities. Notwithstanding 3 any provision of the Illinois Municipal Code, a 9-1-1 vendor 4 under Section 13-900 of the Public Utilities Act must give 5 written notice to the municipality it has a contract with or for which it currently provides emergency services not less 6 than 12 months prior to termination of services. If an 7 8 emergency services contract is terminated, the provider may 9 not increase the fees of any remaining contract by more than 3% 10 of the fees from the previous year. A private sector company that terminates the emergency services contract prior to the 11 12 natural expiration of the contract term and that seeks an 13 increase in the annual contract value of more than 10% is 14 barred from contracting with any units of local government or 15 entities that receive funding for emergency services for a period of 5 years from the date of the notice of contract 16 17 termination.

As used in this Section, "emergency services" includes, but is not limited to, dispatch, 9-1-1, paramedic, or ambulance services.

21 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon 22 becoming law.".
