1	after January 1, 2023, a health care professional who has
2	continuing education requirements must complete at least a
3	one-hour course in training on the diagnosis, treatment, and
4	care of individuals with Alzheimer's disease and other
5	dementias per renewal period. This training shall include, but
6	not be limited to, assessment and diagnosis, effective
7	communication strategies, and management and care planning.
8	This requirement shall only apply to health care professionals
9	who provide health care services to, and have direct patient
10	interactions with, adult populations age 26 or older in the
11	practice of their profession. A health care professional may
12	count this one hour for completion of this course toward
13	meeting the minimum credit hours required for continuing
14	education. Any training on Alzheimer's disease and other
15	dementias applied to meet any other State licensure
16	requirement, professional accreditation or certification
17	requirement, or health care institutional practice agreement
18	may count toward the continuing education requirement under
19	this Section.
