2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 1486 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Children and Family Services Act is
5	amended by adding Section 21.6 as follows:
6	(20 ILCS 505/21.6 new)
7	Sec. 21.6. Front-line staff members; personal protection
8	spray devices.
9	(a) As used in this Section:
10	"Front-line staff member" or "staff member" means an
11	individual who engages with families in their home settings.
12	"Personal protection spray device" means a commercially
13	available dispensing device designed and intended for use in
14	self-defense which is comprised of non-lethal Oleoresin
15	Capsicum and is specifically approved by the Department in
16	consultation with the Illinois State Police.

(b) A	front-line staff member is authorized to carry and
use pers	sonal protection spray devices for self-defense
purposes	while investigating a report of child abuse or
<u>neglect i</u>	f the front-line staff member has been trained on the
proper us	se of such personal protection spray devices by the
Illinois	State Police. By January 1, 2023, the Department and
the Illi	nois State Police shall (i) identify a list of
approved	personal protection spray devices and (ii) jointly
develop a	and approve a training curriculum and program for
<u>front-lin</u>	e staff members on the proper use of such personal
protectio	n spray devices for self-defense purposes. The
Departmen	t shall provide funding for the training program.
(C)	Personal protection spray device use. A personal
protectio	n spray device may only be used if a front-line staff
member:	
_(1) reasonably believes that use is necessary to
prote	ct the staff member from an imminent physical assault
posed	by another person;
_(2) uses the device to incapacitate a person
attem	pting a physical assault in order to avoid imminent
physi	cal harm and to facilitate escape from danger when
there	is no other alternative available to the staff
membe	<u>r;</u>
	3) uses a device approved by the Department in
consu	ltation with the Illinois State Police;

(4) except in exigent circumstances, has issued a

1	verbal warning to persons in close proximity to the spray
2	area in accordance with the training jointly developed by
3	the Department and the Illinois State Police;
4	(5) does not intentionally spray any person other than
5	a person attempting to physically assault the front-line
6	staff member; and
7	(6) has successfully completed training on how to use
8	the approved devices, de-escalation techniques,
9	pre-contact cues, and situation awareness.
10	A front-line staff member's use of personal protection
11	spray devices during the performance of his or her
12	professional duties in any manner other than as expressly
13	authorized under this Section shall be prohibited by
14	Department policy. Whenever a front-line staff member
15	discharges a personal protection spray device, the front-line
16	staff member shall complete an incident report.
17	(d) Duty to seek medical care for bystanders. Following
18	the discharge of a personal protection spray device that
19	results in exposure, the front-line staff member shall notify
20	his or her supervisor and, if appropriate, call 9-1-1 for
21	emergency response or responders as soon as reasonably
22	practical and when safe to do so.
23	(e) Reporting. Beginning January 1, 2024, and every
24	January 1 thereafter, the Department shall post on its website
25	a report containing the following information for the
26	preceding calendar year: (i) the number of front-line staff

- members trained to carry personal protection spray devices; 1
- 2 (ii) the number of front-line staff members reporting personal
- protection spray devices and the make or model of the devices; 3
- 4 and (iii) the number of reported uses of personal protection
- 5 spray devices by service region.
- 6 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 7 becoming law.".
