SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

430 ILCS 65/5
430 ILCS 66/50

from Ch. 38, par. 83-5

Amends the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act. Provides that a renewed Firearm Owner's Identification Card issued under the Act shall be valid for the person to whom it is issued for a period of 10 years from the date of expiration on the previously issued Card. Amends the Firearm Concealed Carry Act. Provides that a renewed license under the Act shall be valid for the person to whom it is issued for a period of 5 years from the date of expiration of the previously issued license. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning safety.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Firearm Owners Identification Card Act is
5 amended by changing Section 5 as follows:

6 (430 ILCS 65/5) (from Ch. 38, par. 83-5)

7 Sec. 5. Application and renewal.

8 (a) The Department of State Police shall either approve or
9 deny all applications within 30 days from the date they are
10 received, except as provided in subsection (b) of this
11 Section, and every applicant found qualified under Section 8
12 of this Act by the Department shall be entitled to a Firearm
13 Owner's Identification Card upon the payment of a \$10 fee. Any
14 applicant who is an active duty member of the Armed Forces of
15 the United States, a member of the Illinois National Guard, or
16 a member of the Reserve Forces of the United States is exempt
17 from the application fee. \$6 of each fee derived from the
18 issuance of Firearm Owner's Identification Cards, or renewals
19 thereof, shall be deposited in the Wildlife and Fish Fund in
20 the State Treasury; \$1 of the fee shall be deposited in the
21 State Police Services Fund and \$3 of the fee shall be deposited
22 in the State Police Firearm Services Fund.

23 (b) Renewal applications shall be approved or denied

1 within 60 business days, provided the applicant submitted his
2 or her renewal application prior to the expiration of his or
3 her Firearm Owner's Identification Card. If a renewal
4 application has been submitted prior to the expiration date of
5 the applicant's Firearm Owner's Identification Card, the
6 Firearm Owner's Identification Card shall remain valid while
7 the Department processes the application, unless the person is
8 subject to or becomes subject to revocation under this Act.
9 The cost for a renewal application shall be \$10 which shall be
10 deposited into the State Police Firearm Services Fund.

11 (c) A renewed Firearm Owner's Identification Card issued
12 under this Act shall be valid for the person to whom it is
13 issued for a period of 10 years from the date of expiration on
14 the previously issued Card.

16 Section 10. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act is amended by
17 changing Section 50 as follows:

18 (430 ILCS 66/50)

19 Sec. 50. License renewal.

20 (a) This subsection (a) applies through the 180th day
21 following the effective date of this amendatory Act of the
22 101st General Assembly. Applications for renewal of a license
23 shall be made to the Department. A license shall be renewed for
24 a period of 5 years upon receipt of a completed renewal

1 application, completion of 3 hours of training required under
2 Section 75 of this Act, payment of the applicable renewal fee,
3 and completion of an investigation under Section 35 of this
4 Act. The renewal application shall contain the information
5 required in Section 30 of this Act, except that the applicant
6 need not resubmit a full set of fingerprints. A renewed
7 license under this Act shall be valid for the person to whom it
8 is issued for a period of 5 years from the date of expiration
9 of the previously issued license.

10 (b) This subsection (b) applies on and after the 181st day
11 following the effective date of this amendatory Act of the
12 101st General Assembly. Applications for renewal of a license
13 shall be made to the Department. A license shall be renewed for
14 a period of 5 years from the date of expiration on the
15 applicant's current license upon the receipt of a completed
16 renewal application, completion of 3 hours of training
17 required under Section 75 of this Act, payment of the
18 applicable renewal fee, and completion of an investigation
19 under Section 35 of this Act. The renewal application shall
20 contain the information required in Section 30 of this Act,
21 except that the applicant need not resubmit a full set of
22 fingerprints.
