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1	AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1915
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 1915 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Illinois Procurement Code is amended by
5	adding Section 45-23 as follows:
6	(30 ILCS 500/45-23 new)
7	Sec. 45-23. Single-use plastics prohibition; preference.
8	(a) For the purposes of this Section:
9	"Compostable" means that the item meets the ASTM D6400
10	standard of compostability and has been certified by the
11	Biodegradable Products Institute as compostable.
12	"Compostable foodware" means containers, bowls, straws,
13	plates, trays, cartons, cups, lids, forks, spoons, knives, and
14	other items that are designed for one-time use for beverages,
15	prepared food, or leftovers from meals that are compostable.
16	"Plastic" means a synthetic material made from linking

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1	monomers through a chemical reaction to create an organic
2	polymer chain that can be molded or extruded at high heat into
3	various solid forms retaining their defined shapes during
4	their life cycle and after disposal.
5	"Recyclable foodware" means items that are designed for
6	one-time use for beverages, prepared food, or leftovers from
7	meals that are commonly accepted in local curbside residential
8	recycling pick up.
9	"Single-use plastic disposable foodware" means containers,
10	bowls, straws, plates, trays, cartons, cups, lids, forks,
11	spoons, knives, and other items that are designed for one-time
12	use for beverages, prepared food, or leftovers from meals that
13	are made of plastic, are not compostable, and are not accepted
14	in residential curbside recycling pick up.
15	(b) When a State agency or institution of higher education
16	is to award a contract to the lowest responsible bidder, an
17	otherwise qualified bidder who will fulfill the contract
18	through the use of compostable foodware or recyclable foodware
19	may be given preference over other bidders unable to do so;
20	provided that the bid is not more than 5% greater than the cost
21	of products that are not single-use plastic disposable
22	foodware. The contract awarded the cost preference in this
23	subsection (b) shall also include the option of providing the
24	State agency or institution of higher education with
25	single-use plastic straws.
26	(c) When any State contract is to be awarded for or

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1 including single-use disposable foodware, the State agency or institution of higher education shall include a requirement 2 that the responsible bidder or offeror provide a compostable 3 4 or recyclable alternative to single-use disposable foodware. 5 The State agency or institution of higher education shall 6 select the compostable or recyclable alternative unless its cost exceeds its single-use alternative by more than 10%. The 7 8 contract or award that is to be awarded the cost preference in 9 this subsection (c) shall also include the option of providing 10 the State agency or institution of higher education with 11 single-use plastic straws. (d) After January 1, 2023, State agencies and departments 12 13 may not procure single-use plastic disposable foodware for use 14 at any State parks or natural areas, and instead shall offer 15 only compostable foodware or recyclable foodware for use at 16 State parks or natural areas. (e) Aft<u>er January 1, 2024, or at the renewal of its next</u> 17 contract, whichever occurs later, no vendor contracted through 18 19 a State agency or department may provide customers with 20 single-use plastic disposable foodware at any site located at a State park or a natural area, and instead shall offer only 21

22 <u>compostable foodware or recyclable foodware for use at State</u>
23 <u>parks or natural areas.</u>

24 (f) This Section does not apply to the procurement of
 25 supplies for the Illinois State Fair.".
