SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/31-4

from Ch. 38, par. 31-4

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Defines "concealment" for purposes of the obstructing justice statute. Defines "concealment" as hiding evidence in a manner that makes its recovery substantially more difficult or impossible. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by changing Section 31-4 as follows:
- 6 (720 ILCS 5/31-4) (from Ch. 38, par. 31-4)
- 7 Sec. 31-4. Obstructing justice.
- 8 (a) A person obstructs justice when, with intent to 9 prevent the apprehension or obstruct the prosecution or 10 defense of any person, he or she knowingly commits any of the

- 12 (1) Destroys, alters, conceals or disguises physical 13 evidence, plants false evidence, furnishes false 14 information; or
 - (2) Induces a witness having knowledge material to the subject at issue to leave the State or conceal himself or herself; or
 - (3) Possessing knowledge material to the subject at issue, he or she leaves the State or conceals himself; or
 - (4) If a parent, legal guardian, or caretaker of a child under 13 years of age reports materially false information to a law enforcement agency, medical examiner, coroner, State's Attorney, or other governmental agency

- 5 (1) Obstructing justice is a Class 4 felony, except as 6 provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection (b).
 - (2) Obstructing justice in furtherance of streetgang related or gang-related activity, as defined in Section 10 of the Illinois Streetgang Terrorism Omnibus Prevention Act, is a Class 3 felony.
- 11 (c) For purposes of this Section, "concealment" means
 12 hiding evidence in a manner that makes its recovery
 13 substantially more difficult or impossible.
