1 AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Higher Education Student Assistance Act is
amended by changing Section 65.115 as follows:

10 Shortage Loan Repayment Program.

To encourage Illinois students to work, and to 11 (a) continue to work, as a school social worker in public school 12 districts in this State or in State municipalities, the 13 14 Commission shall, each year, receive and consider applications for loan repayment assistance under this Section. This program 15 16 shall be known as the School and Municipal Social Work 17 Repayment Program. The Commission shall Shortage Loan administer the program and shall adopt all necessary and 18 19 proper rules to effectively implement the program.

20 (b) Beginning July 1, 2022, subject to a separate 21 appropriation made for such purposes, the Commission shall 22 award a grant, up to a maximum of \$6,500, to each qualified 23 applicant. The Commission may encourage the recipient of a SB3761 Enrolled - 2 - LRB102 25678 NLB 34972 b

grant under this Section to use the grant award for repayment 1 2 of the recipient's educational loan. If an appropriation for 3 this program for a given fiscal year is insufficient to provide grants to all qualified applicants, the Commission 4 5 shall allocate the appropriation in accordance with this 6 subsection. If funds are insufficient to provide all qualified 7 applicants with a grant as authorized by this Section, the 8 Commission shall allocate the available grant funds for that 9 fiscal year to qualified applicants who submit a complete 10 application on or before a date specified by the Commission, 11 based on the following order of priority:

12 (1) first, to new, qualified applicants who are 13 members of a racial minority as defined in subsection (e); 14 and

15 (2) second, to other new, qualified applicants in16 accordance with this Section.

17 (c) A person is a qualified applicant under this Section18 if he or she meets all of the following qualifications:

19 (1) The person is a United States citizen or eligible20 noncitizen.

(2) The person is a resident of this State.

(3) The person is a borrower with an outstanding
balance due on an educational loan related to obtaining a
degree in social work.

(4) The person has been employed as a school social
 worker by a public elementary school or secondary school

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in this State for at least 12 consecutive months <u>or as a</u>
 <u>social worker for an Illinois municipality who did not</u>
 <u>report directly to a police department</u>.

4 (5) The person is currently employed as a school
5 social worker by a public elementary school or secondary
6 school in this State <u>or as a social worker for an Illinois</u>
7 <u>municipality who does not report directly to a police</u>
8 <u>department</u>.

9 (d) An applicant shall submit an application, in a form 10 determined by the Commission, for grant assistance under this 11 Section to the Commission. An applicant is required to submit, 12 with the application, supporting documentation as the 13 Commission may deem necessary.

Racial minorities are underrepresented as school 14 (e) 15 social workers in elementary and secondary schools and in municipalities in Illinois, and the General Assembly finds 16 17 that it is in the interest of this State to provide them priority consideration for programs that encourage their 18 19 participation in this field and thereby foster a profession 20 that is more reflective of the diversity of Illinois 21 residents, students and parents they will serve. A more 22 reflective workforce in school social work allows improved 23 outcomes for individuals students and a better utilization of services. Therefore, the Commission shall give priority to 24 25 those applicants who are members of a racial minority. In this subsection (e), "racial minority" means a person who is a 26

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- 1 citizen of the United States or a lawful permanent resident 2 alien of the United States and who is:
- 3 (1) Black (a person having origins in any of the black
 4 racial groups in Africa);

5 (2) Hispanic (a person of Spanish or Portuguese 6 culture with origins in Mexico, South or Central America, 7 or the Caribbean Islands, regardless of race);

8 (3) Asian American (a person having origins in any of 9 the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the 10 Indian Subcontinent, or the Pacific Islands); or

(4) American Indian or Alaskan Native (a person having
origins in any of the original peoples of North America).
