SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

720 ILCS 5/19-3

from Ch. 38, par. 19-3

Amends the Criminal Code of 2012. Provides that a person also commits residential burglary when he or she knowingly and without authority enters on the property of another, or any part thereof, with the intent to commit therein a theft of a motor vehicle. Provides that if a person while in possession of a relay vehicle theft device commits residential burglary by knowingly and without authority entering on the property of another, or any part thereof, with the intent to commit therein a theft of a motor vehicle, the penalty is a Class X felony. Defines "relay vehicle theft device". Effective immediately.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

Section 5. The Criminal Code of 2012 is amended by 4 5 changing Section 19-3 as follows:

(720 ILCS 5/19-3) (from Ch. 38, par. 19-3) 6

7 Sec. 19-3. Residential burglary.

(a) A person commits residential burglary when he or she 8 9 knowingly and without authority enters or knowingly and without authority remains within the dwelling place of 10 another, or any part thereof, with the intent to commit 11 therein a felony or theft. This offense includes the offense 12 of burglary as defined in Section 19-1. 13

14 (a-5) A person commits residential burglary when he or she falsely represents himself or herself, including but not 15 16 limited to falsely representing himself or herself to be a representative of any unit of government or a construction, 17 telecommunications, or utility company, for the purpose of 18 19 gaining entry to the dwelling place of another, with the intent to commit therein a felony or theft or to facilitate the 20 21 commission therein of a felony or theft by another.

22 (a-10) A person commits residential burglary when he or she knowingly and without authority enters on the property of 23

3	(b) Sentence. Residential burglary is a Class 1 felony.
4	Residential burglary in violation of subsection (a-10) while
5	in possession of a relay vehicle theft device is a Class X

7	(c) In this Section, "relay vehicle theft device" means a
8	device to unlock and start the motor vehicle without the use or
9	possession of the motor vehicle key.
