SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/21B-40

Amends the School Code. Provides that the application fee for a Short-Term Substitute Teaching License shall be waived when the Governor has declared a disaster due to a public health emergency. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21B-40 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-40)

7 Sec. 21B-40. Fees.

8 (a) Beginning with the start of the new licensure system 9 established pursuant to this Article, the following fees shall 10 be charged to applicants:

(1) A \$100 application fee for a Professional Educator
 License or an Educator License with Stipulations.

13 (1.5) A \$50 application fee for a Substitute Teaching 14 License. If the application for a Substitute Teaching License is made and granted after July 1, 2017, the 15 16 licensee may apply for a refund of the application fee within 18 months of issuance of the new license and shall 17 be issued that refund by the State Board of Education if 18 19 the licensee provides evidence to the State Board of 20 Education that the licensee has taught pursuant to the 21 Substitute Teaching License at least 10 full school days 22 within one year of issuance.

(1.7) A \$25 application fee for a Short-Term

Substitute Teaching License. The Short-Term Substitute 1 2 Teaching License must be registered in at least one region 3 in this State, but does not require a registration fee. The licensee may apply for a refund of the application fee 4 5 within 18 months of issuance of the new license and shall 6 be issued that refund by the State Board of Education if 7 licensee provides evidence to the State Board of the 8 Education that the licensee has taught pursuant to the 9 Short-Term Substitute Teaching License at least 10 full 10 school days within one year of issuance. The application 11 fee for a Short-Term Substitute Teaching License shall be 12 waived when the Governor has declared a disaster due to a public health emergency pursuant to Section 7 of the 13 14 Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act.

(2) A \$150 application fee for individuals who have
not been entitled by an Illinois-approved educator
preparation program at an Illinois institution of higher
education and are seeking any of the licenses set forth in
subdivision (1) of this subsection (a).

20 (3) A \$50 application fee for each endorsement or21 approval.

(4) A \$10 per year registration fee for the course of the validity cycle to register the license, which shall be paid to the regional office of education having supervision and control over the school in which the individual holding the license is to be employed. If the SB3915

individual holding the license is not yet employed, then 1 2 the license may be registered in any county in this State. 3 The registration fee must be paid in its entirety the first time the individual registers the license for a 4 5 particular validity period in a single region. No 6 additional fee may be charged for that validity period 7 should the individual subsequently register the license in 8 additional regions. An individual must register the 9 license (i) immediately after initial issuance of the 10 license and (ii) at the beginning of each renewal cycle if 11 the individual has satisfied the renewal requirements 12 required under this Code.

13 Beginning on July 1, 2017, at the beginning of each 14 renewal cycle, individuals who hold a Substitute Teaching 15 License may apply for a reimbursement of the registration 16 fee within 18 months of renewal and shall be issued that 17 reimbursement by the State Board of Education from funds appropriated for that purpose if the licensee provides 18 evidence to the State Board of Education that the licensee 19 20 has taught pursuant to the Substitute Teaching License at 21 least 10 full school days within one year of renewal.

(5) The license renewal fee for an Educator License
with Stipulations with a paraprofessional educator
endorsement is \$25.

(b) All application fees paid pursuant to subdivisions (1)
through (3) of subsection (a) of this Section shall be

deposited into the Teacher Certificate Fee Revolving Fund and 1 2 shall be used, subject to appropriation, by the State Board of 3 Education to provide the technology and human resources necessary for the timely and efficient processing of 4 5 applications and for the renewal of licenses. Funds available from the Teacher Certificate Fee Revolving Fund may also be 6 used by the State Board of 7 Education to support the 8 recruitment and retention of educators, to support educator 9 preparation programs as they seek national accreditation, and 10 provide professional development aligned with the to 11 requirements set forth in Section 21B-45 of this Code. A 12 majority of the funds in the Teacher Certificate Fee Revolving 13 Fund must be dedicated to the timely and efficient processing of applications and for the renewal of licenses. The Teacher 14 15 Certificate Fee Revolving Fund is not subject to 16 administrative charge transfers, authorized under Section 8h 17 of the State Finance Act, from the Teacher Certificate Fee Revolving Fund into any other fund of this State, and moneys in 18 the Teacher Certificate Fee Revolving Fund shall not revert 19 20 back to the General Revenue Fund at any time.

The regional superintendent of schools shall deposit the registration fees paid pursuant to subdivision (4) of subsection (a) of this Section into the institute fund established pursuant to Section 3-11 of this Code.

(c) The State Board of Education and each regional officeof education are authorized to charge a service or convenience

1 fee for the use of credit cards for the payment of license 2 fees. This service or convenience fee shall not exceed the 3 amount required by the credit card processing company or 4 vendor that has entered into a contract with the State Board or 5 regional office of education for this purpose, and the fee 6 must be paid to that company or vendor.

7 (d) If, at the time a certificate issued under Article 21 8 of this Code is exchanged for a license issued under this 9 Article, a person has paid registration fees for any years of 10 the validity period of the certificate and these years have 11 not expired when the certificate is exchanged, then those fees 12 must be applied to the registration of the new license.
