A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The sum of \$762,344,700, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
7 to the Department of Human Services for ordinary and contingent
8 expenses of the department, permanent improvements and for
9 student, member or inmate compensation expenses of the
10 department for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023.

11 Section 10. The amount of \$9,987,200, or so much thereof
12 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
13 Fund to the Department of Human Services for ordinary and
14 contingent expenses associated with the Office of the Inspector
15 General.

16 The Department, with the consent in writing from the
17 Governor, may reapportion not more than 1 percent of the total
18 appropriation of General Revenue Funds in Section 5 to Section
19 10 above among the various purposes therein enumerated.

20 Section 11. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
2 Fund to the Department of Human Services for grants and
3 administrative expenses to the West Side Justice Center to
4 implement the Access to Justice Program including eviction
5 mitigation, homelessness prevention and related services.

6 Section 12. The amount of \$5,000,000, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue
8 Fund to the Department of Human Services for grants and
9 administrative expenses to the Resurrection Project to
10 implement the Access to Justice Program including eviction
11 mitigation, homelessness prevention and related services.

12
13 Section 13. The sum of \$80,000,000, or so much thereof as
14 may necessary is appropriated to the Department of Human
15 Services from the DHS State Projects Fund for ordinary and
16 contingent expenses, grants and administrative expenses of the
17 department including COVID-19 response and mitigation,
18 including prior year costs.

19 Section 14. The sum of \$80,000,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary is appropriated from the DHS State Projects
21 Fund to the Department of Human Services for Illinois Welcoming
22 Centers.

1 Section 15. The following named amounts, or so much thereof
 2 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
 3 hereinafter named, are appropriated to the Department of Human
 4 Services for income assistance and related distributive
 5 purposes, including such Federal funds as are made available
 6 by the Federal Government for the following purposes:

2 Section 18. The sum of \$98,000,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Affordable
4 Housing Trust Fund to the Department of Human Services for the
5 Emergency Rental Assistance Program authorized by Section 3201
6 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and any associated
7 federal guidance, to fund the permitted purposes of the program
8 including grants for emergency rental assistance and associated
9 administrative costs.

10 Section 19. The sum of \$5,000,000 or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
12 to the Department of Human Services for grants and
13 administrative expenses associated with the Reimagine Public
14 Safety Act.
