1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1

Section 5. The amount of \$2,844,100, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education to meet its operational expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023.

Section 10. The sum of \$381,800, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education for costs and expenses associated with the administration and enforcement associated with the P-20 Longitudinal Education Data System Act.

Section 15. The sum of \$183,300, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education for costs associated with the My Credits Transfer System.

Section 20. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund

The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2022, from appropriations heretofore made for such purpose in Article 111, Section 66 of Public Act 102-0017 as amended, is reappropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Board of Higher Education for costs and expenses associated with a Public Higher Education Assessment in the Quad Cities.
- Section 70. The sum of \$150,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Distance Learning Fund to the Board of Higher Education as supplemental support for costs and expenses associated with the administration and enforcement of 110 ILCS 145/40.

Section 135. The sum of \$30,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the IMSA Income Fund to the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy for awards and grants.

6 ARTICLE 2

Section 5. The sum of \$1,033,700, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2022, from appropriations heretofore made for such purpose in Article 127, Section 455 of Public Act 102-0017, as amended, is reappropriated from the State Coronavirus Urgent Remediation Emergency Fund to the Board of Higher Education to the Grow Your Own Teachers Program for costs and expenses associated with the Historically Disadvantaged Male Initiative, for purposes permitted by Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and related federal guidance.

17 Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2022.
