A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

22 Section 15. The sum of \$400,000, or so much thereof as may
23 be necessary, is appropriated from the U.S. Environmental

1 Protection Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for all
2 costs associated with environmental projects as defined by
3 federal assistance awards.

4 Section 20. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary, is appropriated from the Oil Spill Response Fund
6 to the Environmental Protection Agency for use in accordance
7 with Section 25c-1 of the Environmental Protection Act.

8 Section 25. The amount of \$4,000,000, or so much thereof
9 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Environmental
10 Protection Trust Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency
11 for awards and grants as directed by the Environmental
12 Protection Trust Fund Commission.

13 Section 30. The sum of \$23,000,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Illinois Environmental
15 Protection Agency from the Motor Fuel Tax Fund for deposit into
16 the Vehicle Inspection Fund.

10 Section 240. The sum of \$1,130,900, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Environmental
12 Protection Permit and Inspection Fund for costs associated with
13 handling appeals from permitting and other determinations made
14 by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.

15 ARTICLE 2

16 Section 5. The sum of \$80,000,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, and remains unexpended, at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2022, from the appropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 82, section 10, and Article 82, section 15, of
20 Public Act 102-0017 as amended, is reappropriated from the VW
21 Settlement Environmental Mitigation Fund to the Environmental

1 Protection Agency for all costs, including administrative
2 expenses, associated with funding eligible mitigation actions
3 that achieve reductions of emissions in accordance with the
4 Environmental Mitigation Trust Agreement relating to the
5 Partial Consent Decree between U.S. Department of Justice,
6 Volkswagen AG and other settling defendants.

7 Section 10. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, and remains unexpended, at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2022, from the appropriation heretofore
10 made in Article 81 Section 160, of Public Act 102-0017 as
11 amended, is reappropriated from the Energy Efficiency Trust
12 Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for grants pursuant
13 to subsection (b) of Section 6-6 of the Renewable Energy, Energy
14 Efficiency, and Coal Resources Development Law of 1997.

15 ARTICLE 99

16 Section 999. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
17 1, 2022.
