SENATE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to learn of the death of Dale Michael Geiss, MD, who passed away on June 11, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Geiss was born in Mandan, North Dakota to Lawrence and Clara Geiss on April 6, 1944; he was an excellent student and was chosen to enter the Catholic seminary at the age of 14; he finished high school and two years of college at St. John's Seminary; he earned a degree from North Dakota State University and did his graduate work in neuropsychology; he received his medical degree from Baylor University in Texas; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Geiss completed surgical residencies in California, Wisconsin, and Toronto; he became proficient in both adult and pediatric cardiac surgery; he settled in Peoria and established a reputation for superior skills and immense compassion; he founded the Children's Heart Institute in 1980 and accomplished many "firsts", such as pediatric mitral valve repair and the Norwood procedure; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Geiss spent most of his surgical career at OSF St. Francis in Peoria; later, he helped revive struggling programs in the Quad Cities and Champaign-Urbana; he completed

- 1 12,000 surgeries over his lifetime; and

- 4 watching sports, especially football, and caring for stray

- 8 has four grown children and three grandkids; Amy and her
