WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to learn of the death of Thomas J. "Tom" Mikulecky of Peoria, who passed away on September 26, 2021; and

5 WHEREAS, Tom Mikulecky was born to Dr. Elston J. 6 Mikulecky, D.D.S. and Doris Alberta Charleston Mikulecky in Minneapolis, Minnesota on November 8, 1938; he attended 7 8 Glencoe Public Schools in Minnesota, where he played baritone; 9 he earned his Bachelor of Science in Political 10 Science/International Relations from the University of 11 Minnesota in 1960, where he was a member of the marching band; he received his master's degree in International Relations 12 13 from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy of Harvard and 14 Tufts Universities in 1961; he served in the U.S. military 15 from 1962 to 1964, where he was deployed as first lieutenant to Okinawa, Japan; he completed his doctorate in Political 16 17 Science/Public Administration at the University of Arizona; 18 and

WHEREAS, Tom Mikulecky taught as a full-time adjunct professor at Southern Methodist University; he later taught at Illinois Wesleyan University, Illinois State University, and Heartland Community College in Bloomington; he noted his greatest enjoyment in teaching was when his students brought

- 2 into the current curriculum topic; and

WHEREAS, Tom Mikulecky worked on developing grants to supplement the City of Tucson's capital improvements program as his first administrative job; he then served as assistant to the city manager for intergovernmental services of the City of Dallas, Texas; after a teaching stint at Southern Methodist University, he returned to management as county manager of Summit County, Colorado; he then served as city manager of Bartlesville, Oklahoma and Peoria, Illinois; before retiring, he performed municipal management consulting services for a variety of cities and organizations, including as acting administrator of Pekin, city administrator of Farmer City, city manager of Streator, city administrator of Braidwood, and city administrator of Carpentersville; and

WHEREAS, Tom Mikulecky was deeply committed to his faith, and he participated in the Newmann Center at the University of Minnesota; he loved music and sang bass throughout his life, culminating in several years with the men's choir of the Orpheus Club of Peoria; he also enjoyed fishing, golfing, dancing, and walking the beach with his wife on South Padre Island, Texas; and

WHEREAS, Tom Mikulecky was known for his deep voice, large
