- 16 March of each year is designated as Irish-American Heritage
- 17 Month to be observed throughout the State as a month to
- 18 recognize the contributions and influence of the Irish on
- American history, achievement, culture, and innovation.
- 20 (5 ILCS 490/5.04 new)
- Sec. 5.04. Child Abuse Prevention Month. The month of
- 22 April of each year is designated as Child Abuse Prevention
- 23 Month to be observed throughout the State to promote the

- 1 awareness and prevention of child abuse in the State, to bring
- recognition to child abuse survivors, and to honor those who 2
- tragically died as a result of abuse and neglect. 3

- 23 celebrate the vibrancy and importance of Illinois'

- 1 Jewish-American citizens whose accomplishments and
- 2 <u>contributions strengthen and enrich culture</u>, governance, the
- 3 economy, education, and all aspects of community life in the
- 4 State.

- 6 Sec. 5.08. LGBTQ+ Pride Month. The month of June of each
- 7 year is designated as LGBTQ+ Pride Month to be observed
- 8 throughout the State as a month to recognize the beautiful
- 9 diversity of LGBTQ+ communities while acknowledging that the
- 10 movement to advance the human rights of LGBTQ+ persons has
- 11 been one of both struggle and progress and that all
- 12 Illinoisans can contribute to the movement by uplifting
- inclusion and equity for all.

- 15 <u>Sec. 5.09. Disability Pride Month. The month of July of</u>
- 16 each year is designated as Disability Pride Month to be
- 17 observed throughout the State as a month to celebrate disabled

- 19 they are, reclaiming visibility in public, and interacting
- 20 fully with their disabilities unapologetically.

- Sec. 5.10. National Hispanic American Heritage Month. The
- 23 month of September 15 to October 15 of each year is designated

- 1 as National Hispanic American Heritage Month as a time to
- 2 recognize and celebrate the many contributions, diverse
- cultures, and extensive histories of the Hispanic and Latino 3
- 4 American community. The month serves as a powerful reminder of
- 5 not only where Latino communities have come from, but also
- their successes and the ways in which representation in 6
- 7 government contributes to that success.
- 8 (5 ILCS 490/5.11 new)
- 9 Sec. 5.11. Italian-American Heritage Month. The month of
- 10 October of each year is designated as Italian-American
- 11 Heritage Month to be observed throughout the State as a month
- 12 to recognize and celebrate the cultural heritage,
- 13 contributions, and influence of Italians on American history,
- 14 achievement, culture, and innovation.
- 15 (5 ILCS 490/5.12 new)
- Sec. 5.12. Polish-American Heritage Month. The month of 16
- 17 October of each year is designated as Polish-American Heritage
- 18 Month to be observed throughout the State as a month to
- 19 recognize the contributions and lasting impact of the Polish
- people on American history, achievement, culture, identity, 20
- 21 growth, and innovation.
- 2.2 (5 ILCS 490/5.13 new)
- 23 Sec. 5.13. Native American Heritage Month. The month of

- 1 November of each year is designated as Native American
- 2 Heritage Month to be observed throughout the State as a month
- 3 to celebrate rich and diverse cultures, traditions, and
- 4 histories of Native American communities and to acknowledge
- 5 the importance of indigenous peoples' contributions to
- 6 Illinois and to the United States.
- 7 (5 ILCS 490/194.5 new)
- 8 Sec. 194.5. United States Constitution Day. September 17
- 9 of each year is designated as United States Constitution Day,
- 10 to be observed throughout the State as a day to celebrate and
- remember the founding document of the United States and the 11
- 12 founding principles of the United States.
- 13 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 14 becoming law.".
