2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 1551 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Freedom of Information Act is amended by
5	changing Section 2 as follows:
6	(5 ILCS 140/2) (from Ch. 116, par. 202)
7	Sec. 2. Definitions. As used in this Act:
8	(a) "Public body" means all legislative, executive,
9	administrative, or advisory bodies of the State, state
10	universities and colleges, counties, townships, cities,
11	villages, incorporated towns, school districts and all other
12	municipal corporations, boards, bureaus, committees, or
13	commissions of this State, any subsidiary bodies of any of the
14	foregoing including but not limited to committees and
15	subcommittees thereof, and a School Finance Authority created
16	under Article 1E of the School Code. "Public body" does not

include a child death review team or the Illinois Child Death Review Teams Executive Council established under the Child Death Review Team Act, or a regional youth advisory board or the Statewide Youth Advisory Board established under the Department of Children and Family Services Statewide Youth Advisory Board Act.

7 (b) "Person" means any individual, corporation, 8 partnership, firm, organization or association, acting 9 individually or as a group.

10 (c) "Public records" means all records, reports, forms, 11 letters, memoranda, books, writings, papers, maps, photographs, microfilms, cards, tapes, recordings, electronic 12 13 data processing records, electronic communications, recorded 14 information and all other documentary materials pertaining to 15 the transaction of public business, regardless of physical 16 form or characteristics, having been prepared by or for, or having been or being used by, received by, in the possession 17 18 of, or under the control of any public body.

(c-5) "Private information" means unique identifiers, 19 20 including a person's social security number, driver's license 21 number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access 22 codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, 23 24 and personal email addresses. Private information also 25 includes home address and personal license plates, except as 26 otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility 1 of attribution to any person.

(c-10) "Commercial purpose" means the use of any part of a 2 public record or records, or information derived from public 3 4 records, in any form for sale, resale, or solicitation or 5 advertisement for sales or services. For purposes of this definition, requests made by news media and non-profit, 6 scientific, or academic organizations shall not be considered 7 to be made for a "commercial purpose" when the principal 8 9 purpose of the request is (i) to access and disseminate 10 information concerning news and current or passing events, 11 (ii) for articles of opinion or features of interest to the public, or (iii) for the purpose of academic, scientific, or 12 13 public research or education.

(d) "Copying" means the reproduction of any public record by means of any photographic, electronic, mechanical or other process, device or means now known or hereafter developed and available to the public body.

(e) "Head of the public body" means the president, mayor, chairman, presiding officer, director, superintendent, manager, supervisor or individual otherwise holding primary executive and administrative authority for the public body, or such person's duly authorized designee.

(f) "News media" means a newspaper or other periodical issued at regular intervals whether in print or electronic format, a news service whether in print or electronic format, a radio station, a television station, a television network, a 1 community antenna television service, or a person or 2 corporation engaged in making news reels or other motion 3 picture news for public showing.

(g) "Recurrent requester", as used in Section 3.2 of this 4 5 Act, means a person that, in the 12 months immediately preceding the request, has submitted to the same public body 6 (i) a minimum of 50 requests for records, (ii) a minimum of 15 7 requests for records within a 30-day period, or (iii) a 8 9 minimum of 7 requests for records within a 7-day period. For 10 purposes of this definition, requests made by news media and 11 non-profit, scientific, or academic organizations shall not be considered in calculating the number of requests made in the 12 13 time periods in this definition when the principal purpose of the requests is (i) to access and disseminate information 14 15 concerning news and current or passing events, (ii) for 16 articles of opinion or features of interest to the public, or (iii) for the purpose of academic, scientific, or public 17 research or education. 18

For the purposes of this subsection (g), "request" means a written document (or oral request, if the public body chooses to honor oral requests) that is submitted to a public body via personal delivery, mail, telefax, electronic mail, or other means available to the public body and that identifies the particular public record the requester seeks. One request may identify multiple records to be inspected or copied.

(h) "Voluminous request" means a request that: (i)

1 includes more than 5 individual requests for more than 5 different categories of records or a combination of individual 2 requests that total requests for more than 5 different 3 4 categories of records in a period of 20 business days; or (ii) 5 compilation of more than 500 letter requires the or 6 legal-sized pages of public records unless a single requested record exceeds 500 pages. "Single requested record" 7 mav include, but is not limited to, one report, form, e-mail, 8 9 letter, memorandum, book, map, microfilm, tape, or recording.

10 "Voluminous request" does not include a request made by 11 media non-profit, scientific, or news and academic organizations if the principal purpose of the request is: (1) 12 13 to access and disseminate information concerning news and current or passing events; (2) for articles of opinion or 14 15 features of interest to the public; or (3) for the purpose of 16 academic, scientific, or public research or education.

For the purposes of this subsection (h), "request" means a 17 written document, or oral request, if the public body chooses 18 to honor oral requests, that is submitted to a public body via 19 20 personal delivery, mail, telefax, electronic mail, or other 21 means available to the public body and that identifies the 22 particular public record or records the requester seeks. One 23 request may identify multiple individual records to be 24 inspected or copied.

(i) "Severance agreement" means a mutual agreement betweenany public body and its employee for the employee's

2	(j) "Prevail" means to achieve the desired outcome of the
3	plaintiff through a court order, the production of all
4	requested documents, or the production of a substantial
5	portion of all requested documents to the extent that the
6	requester indicates to the court that the request has been
7	satisfied.
