AN ACT concerning transportation.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 5 changing Section 3-808.1 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/3-808.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-808.1)

7 Sec. 3-808.1. Permanent vehicle registration plate.

8 (a) Permanent vehicle registration plates shall be issued,9 at no charge, to the following:

Vehicles, other than medical transport vehicles,
 owned and operated by the State of Illinois or by any State
 agency financed by funds appropriated by the General
 Assembly;

14 2. Special disability plates issued to vehicles owned
15 and operated by the State of Illinois or by any State
16 agency financed by funds appropriated by the General
17 Assembly.

(b) Permanent vehicle registration plates shall be issued,for a one-time fee of \$8.00, to the following:

Vehicles, other than medical transport vehicles,
 operated by or for any county, township or municipal
 corporation.

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2. Vehicles owned by counties, townships or municipal

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corporations for persons with disabilities.

2 3. Beginning with the 1991 registration year, 3 county-owned vehicles operated by or for any county 4 sheriff and designated deputy sheriffs. These registration 5 plates shall contain the specific county code and unit 6 number.

7 4. All-terrain vehicles owned by counties, townships, 8 or municipal corporations and used for law enforcement 9 purposes when the Manufacturer's Statement of Origin is 10 accompanied with a letter from the original manufacturer 11 or a manufacturer's franchised dealer stating that this 12 all-terrain vehicle has been converted to a street worthy 13 vehicle that meets the equipment requirements set forth in 14 Chapter 12 of this Code.

15 5. Beginning with the 2001 registration year, 16 municipally owned vehicles operated by or for any police 17 department. These registration plates shall contain the 18 designation "municipal police" and shall be numbered and 19 distributed as prescribed by the Secretary of State.

20 6. Beginning with the 2014 registration year, municipally owned, fire district owned, or Mutual Aid Box 21 22 Alarm System (MABAS) owned vehicles operated by or for any 23 fire department, fire protection district, or MABAS. These registration plates shall display the designation "Fire 24 25 Department" and shall display the specific fire department, fire district, fire unit, or MABAS division 26

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1 number or letter.

7. Beginning with the 2017 registration year, vehicles that do not require a school bus driver permit under Section 6-104 to operate and are not registered under Section 3-617 of this Code, and are owned by a public school district from grades K-12 or a public community college.

8. Beginning with the 2017 registration year, vehicles 9 of the first division or vehicles of the second division 10 weighing not more than 8,000 pounds that are owned by a 11 medical facility or hospital of a municipality, county, or 12 township.

9. Beginning with the 2020 registration year, 2-axle 13 14 motor vehicles that (i) are designed and used as buses in a 15 public system for transporting more than 10 passengers; 16 (ii) are used as common carriers in the general 17 transportation of passengers and not devoted to any specialized purpose; (iii) operate entirely within the 18 territorial limits of a single municipality or a single 19 municipality and contiguous municipalities; and (iv) are 20 21 subject to the regulation of the Illinois Commerce 22 Commission. The owner of a vehicle under this paragraph is 23 exempt from paying a flat weight tax or a mileage weight 24 tax under this Code.

(b-5) Beginning with the 2016 registration year, permanent
 vehicle registration plates shall be issued for a one-time fee

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of \$8.00 to a county, township, or municipal corporation that 1 2 owns or operates vehicles used for the purpose of community workplace commuting as defined by the Secretary of State by 3 administrative rule. The design and color of the plates shall 4 5 be wholly within the discretion of the Secretary. The Secretary of State may adopt rules 6 to implement this 7 subsection (b-5).

8 (C) with the 2012 registration Beginning year, 9 county-owned vehicles operated by or for any county sheriff and designated deputy sheriffs that have 10 been issued 11 registration plates under subsection (b) of this Section shall 12 be exempt from any fee for the transfer of registration from 13 one vehicle to another vehicle. Each county sheriff shall report to the Secretary of State any transfer of registration 14 15 plates from one vehicle to another vehicle operated by or for 16 any county sheriff and designated deputy sheriffs. The 17 Secretary of State shall adopt rules to implement this subsection (c). 18

19 (c-5)Beginning with the 2014 registration year, 20 municipally owned, fire district owned, or Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) owned vehicles operated by or for any 21 22 fire department, fire protection district, or MABAS that have 23 been issued registration plates under subsection (b) of this Section shall be exempt from any fee for the transfer of 24 25 registration from one vehicle to another vehicle. the Secretary of State any transfer of registration plates from one vehicle to another vehicle operated by or for any fire department, fire protection district, or MABAS. The Secretary of State shall adopt rules to implement this subsection.

5 (d) Beginning with the 2013 registration year, municipally owned vehicles operated by or for any police department that 6 7 have been issued registration plates under subsection (b) of 8 this Section shall be exempt from any fee for the transfer of 9 registration from one vehicle to another vehicle. Each 10 municipal police department shall report to the Secretary of 11 State any transfer of registration plates from one vehicle to 12 another vehicle operated by or for any municipal police 13 department. The Secretary of State shall adopt rules to 14 implement this subsection (d).

(e) Beginning with the 2016 registration year, any vehicle 15 16 owned or operated by a county, township, or municipal 17 corporation that has been issued registration plates under this Section is exempt from any fee for the transfer of 18 registration from one vehicle to another vehicle. Each county, 19 20 township, or municipal corporation shall report to the Secretary of State any transfer of registration plates from 21 22 one vehicle to another vehicle operated by or for any county, 23 township, or municipal corporation.

(f) Beginning with the 2020 registration year, any vehicle
owned or operated by a public school district from grades
K-12, a public community college, or a medical facility or

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hospital of a municipality, county, or township that has been 1 2 issued registration plates under this Section is exempt from 3 any fee for the transfer of registration from one vehicle to another vehicle. Each school district, public community 4 5 college, or medical facility or hospital shall report to the Secretary any transfer of registration plates from one vehicle 6 7 to another vehicle operated by the school district, public 8 community college, or medical facility.

9 (g) Beginning with the 2025 registration year, vehicles 10 owned or operated by or for a private or public university 11 police department or a private or public college police 12 department, except for motor driven cycles and all-terrain vehicles, may be registered under subsection (b) of this 13 14 Section. These registration plates shall contain the designation "university police" or "college police" and shall 15 16 be numbered and distributed as prescribed by the Secretary of 17 State.
