1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 2123 2 AMENDMENT NO. . Amend House Bill 2123 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following: 3 "Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the 4 5 Digital Forgeries Act. 6 Section 5. Definitions. As used in this Act: 7 "Digital forgery" means any video or sound recording, 8 electronic image, or photograph, or any technological 9

electronic image, or photograph, or any technological representation of speech or conduct substantially derivative thereof, that has been materially manipulated, altered, or annotated to falsely appear to a reasonable person to be an authentic record of an act, a statement, or the conduct, absence, or presence of an individual.

"Official proceeding" includes any federal, State, local, tribal, administrative adjudication, election, or rulemaking proceeding.

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- 1 Section 10. Civil action.
 - (a) An individual has a cause of action against any person who intentionally distributes a digital forgery depicting that individual, when the person knows or recklessly disregards the fact that it is a digital forgery and without the depicted individual's consent:
 - (1) in order to harass, extort, threaten, or cause physical harm, or substantial emotional or economic harm, to an individual falsely depicted;
 - (2) with reckless disregard for whether such distribution will cause physical harm, or substantial emotional or economic harm, to an individual falsely depicted; or
 - (3) in order to incite violence or interfere with an official proceeding.
 - (b) This Section does not apply to digitally manipulated audiovisual material that is clearly and conspicuously identified to make clear to a reasonable person that it is not an authentic record of an act, a statement, or the conduct, absence, or presence of an individual, such as parody or satire, unless the material appears to be a sexual image as defined in subsection (14) of Section 5 of the Civil Remedies for Nonconsensual Dissemination of Private Sexual Images Act.
 - (c) A depicted individual's consent to the creation of a digital forgery shall not alone establish consent to the

- Section 15. Remedies. 2

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- (a) Under this Act, a prevailing plaintiff may be awarded:
- (1) The greater of:
 - (A) economic and noneconomic damages proximately caused by the creation or distribution of the digital forgery, including damages for emotional distress regardless of whether they are accompanied by other damages; or
 - (B) statutory damages not to exceed \$10,000 against each defendant found liable under this Act for all disclosures and threatened disclosures by the defendant of which the plaintiff knew or reasonably should have known when filing the action or that became known during the pendency of the action.
 - (2) An amount equal to any monetary gain made by the defendant from the creation, distribution, or solicitation of creation of the digital forgery.
 - (3) Punitive damages.
 - (4) The costs of the action, including reasonable attorney's fees and other reasonable litigation costs.
 - (5) Additional relief, including equitable relief, such as a temporary restraining order, a preliminary injunction, or a permanent injunction ordering the defendant to cease the display or disclosure of the

- (b) This Act does not affect a right or remedy available 2
- under any other law of this State. 3
- 4 Section 20. Preservation of anonymity. In ordering relief
- under this Act, the court may grant injunctive relief 5
- maintaining the confidentiality of a plaintiff using a 6
- 7 pseudonym.
- 8 Section 25. Severability. The provisions of this Act are
- severable under Section 1.31 of the Statute on Statutes.". 9
