2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 2154 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4	"Section 5. The Counties Code is amended by adding Section
5	5-12022 as follows:
6	(55 ILCS 5/5-12022 new)
7	Sec. 5-12022. Battery-charged fences.
8	(a) As used in this Section, "battery-charged fence" means
9	a fence energized by a battery that is not more than 12 volts
10	of direct current that interfaces with an alarm system in a
11	manner that enables the fence to cause the connected alarm
12	system to transmit a signal intended to notify law enforcement
13	of a potential intrusion.
14	(b) Notwithstanding any other law, a county may not
15	require a permit or other approval for the installation,
16	maintenance, placement, replacement, or servicing of a

battery-charged fence if (i) the battery-charged fence is 1 located on nonresidential property completely surrounded by a 2 nonelectric perimeter fence or wall that is not less than 5 3 4 feet in height and does not exceed 10 feet in height or 2 feet 5 higher than the nonelectric perimeter fence or wall, whichever 6 is higher, and (ii) any electrical charge produced on contact does not exceed energizer characteristics set for electric 7 8 fences by the International Electrotechnical Commission. 9 (c) Any battery-charged fence installed under this Section 10 must have conspicuous signs located on the fence placed not 11 less than 30 feet apart that read: "WARNING: ELECTRIC FENCE". (d) A home rule county may not regulate battery-charged 12 13 fencing in a manner inconsistent with this Section. This 14 Section is a limitation under subsection (i) of Section 6 of 15 Article VII of the Illinois Constitution on the concurrent 16 exercise by home rule units of powers and functions exercised 17 by the State.

Section 10. The Township Code is amended by adding Section 19 110-80 as follows:

22	(a) As used in this Section, "battery-charged fence" means

a fence energized by a battery that is not more than 12 volts 23

1 manner that enables the fence to cause the connected alarm system to transmit a signal intended to notify law enforcement 2 3 of a potential intrusion. 4 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a municipality may not 5 require a permit or other approval for the installation, maintenance, placement, replacement, or servicing of a 6 battery-charged fence if (i) the battery-charged fence is 7 located on nonresidential property completely surrounded by a 8 9 nonelectric perimeter fence or wall that is not less than 5 10 feet in height and does not exceed 10 feet in height or 2 feet 11 higher than the nonelectric perimeter fence or wall, whichever is higher, and (ii) any electrical charge produced on contact 12 13 does not exceed energizer characteristics set for electric 14 fences by the International Electrotechnical Commission. 15 (c) Any battery-charged fence installed under this Section 16 must have conspicuous signs located on the fence placed not less than 30 feet apart that read: "WARNING: ELECTRIC FENCE". 17 (d) A home rule municipality may not regulate 18 19 battery-charged fencing in a manner inconsistent with this 20 Section. This Section is a limitation under subsection (i) of 21 Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution on the 22 concurrent exercise by home rule units of powers and functions 23 exercised by the State.".
