SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 10/4.6

Amends the Child Care Act of 1969. Provides that child care facilities, within the facilities' discretion, may accept a sincerely held religious exemption to a specific vaccination from an employee if the employee presents to the employer a signed statement of objection, detailing the grounds for the sincerely held objection. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Child Care Act of 1969 is amended by
5 changing Section 4.6 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 10/4.6)

7 Sec. 4.6. Vaccination requirements for employees. No
8 person may be employed by a child care facility that cares for
9 children ages 6 and under unless that person shows proof of
10 having received: (i) one dose of the Tdap (tetanus,
11 diphtheria, and pertussis) vaccine; and (ii) 2 doses of the
12 measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine or shows proof of
13 immunity to MMR. Child care facilities, within the facilities'
14 discretion, may accept a sincerely held religious exemption to
15 a specific vaccination from an employee if the employee
16 presents to the employer a signed statement of objection,
17 detailing the grounds for the sincerely held objection.
