Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, as follows:

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AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

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ARTICLE 1

Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much thereof 5 6 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes 7 hereinafter named, are appropriated to meet the ordinary and 8 of the Illinois Criminal contingent expenses Justice 9 Information Authority:

3 Section 10. The amount of \$525,000, or so much thereof as 4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund 5 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for the 6 Illinois Family Violence Coordinating Council Program.

7 Section 15. The amount of \$550,000, or so much thereof as 8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund 9 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for all 10 costs associated with Bullying Prevention.

Section 20. The amount of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for all costs associated with technical assistance and navigation of the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act.

16 Section 25. The amount of \$13,000,000, or so much thereof 17 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Illinois Criminal 18 Justice Information Authority from the General Revenue Fund for 19 administrative costs, awards and grants for Adult Redeploy and 20 Diversion Programs. 1 Section 30. The amount of \$1,200,000, or so much thereof 2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 3 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 4 the purpose of awarding grants, contracts, administrative 5 expenses and all related costs for the Safe From the Start 6 Program.

Section 35. The amount of \$16,342,700, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for administrative costs, awards and grants for Community-Based Violence Prevention Programs, including prior year costs.

Section 40. The amount of \$6,694,300, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for grants and administrative expenses related to Metropolitan Family Services' support of street intervention programming.

Section 45. The amount of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for a grant to the Safer Foundation for violence prevention services and any associated administrative expenses.

1 Section 50. The amount of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof 2 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 3 grants to local law enforcement agencies, other first 4 responders, and co-responders for training and other allowable 5 6 costs pursuant to the Community-Law Enforcement and Other First Responder Partnership for Deflection and Addiction Treatment 7 Act and any associated administrative expenses. 8

9 Section 55. The amount of \$600,000, or so much thereof as 10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund 11 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 12 costs associated with implementation of the SAFE-T Act.

13 Section 60. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much thereof 14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 15 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 16 grants and administrative expenses associated with statewide 17 deferred prosecution funding programs.

18 Section 65. The amount of \$350,000, or so much thereof as 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund 20 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 21 grants and administrative expenses associated with the Domestic 22 Violence Fatality Review Committee.

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1 Section 70. The amount of \$545,100, or so much thereof as 2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund 3 to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 4 grants and administrative expenses associated with the 5 Innovations Institute.

6 Section 75. The amount of \$3,176,200, or so much thereof 7 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 8 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 9 grants and administrative expenses related to trauma recovery 10 centers.

Section 80. The amount of \$30,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for deposit into the Violent Crime Witness Protection Program Fund.

15 Section 82. The amount of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof 16 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 17 Fund to the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority for 18 grants to local law enforcement agencies related to less lethal 19 devices, less lethal device training, and other allowable costs 20 associated with less lethal weapon alternatives, and any 21 associated administrative expenses. -6- OMB103 00081 MLH 45081 b

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Section 83. 7 Section 85.
