The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may 3 be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the non-federal cost 4 5 share of a Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program to long-term contracts and permanent conservation 6 establish easements in the Illinois River Basin; to fund cost share 7 8 assistance to landowners to encourage approved conservation 9 practices in environmentally sensitive and highly erodible 10 areas of the Illinois River Basin; and to fund the monitoring of long-term improvements of these conservation practices as 11 12 required in the Memorandum of Agreement between the State of 13 Illinois and the United States Department of Agriculture.
