SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 5/5-715

Amends the Department of Professional Regulation Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois. In a provision concerning expedited licensure for service members and spouses, provides that a department shall waive any application, examination, or licensure fee for a service member or the service member's spouse. Removes references to fees.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
amended by changing Section 5-715 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 5/5-715)

Sec. 5-715. Expedited licensure for service members and
spouses.

9 (a) In this Section, "service member" means any person who, at the time of application under this Section, is an 10 active duty member of the United States Armed Forces or any 11 reserve component of the United States Armed Forces, the Coast 12 Guard, or the National Guard of any state, commonwealth, or 13 14 territory of the United States or the District of Columbia or whose active duty service concluded within the preceding 2 15 16 years before application.

Department of Financial and 17 Professional (a-5) The Regulation shall within 180 days after January 1, 2020 (the 18 19 effective date of Public Act 101-240) designate one staff 20 member as the military liaison within the Department of 21 Financial and Professional Regulation to ensure proper 22 enactment of the requirements of this Section. The military liaison's responsibilities shall also include, but are not 23

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limited to: (1) the management of all expedited applications 1 2 to ensure processing within 30 days after receipt of a completed application; (2) coordination with all military 3 installation military and family support center directors 4 5 within this State, including virtual, phone, or in-person periodic meetings with each military installation military and 6 7 family support center; and (3) training by the military liaison to all directors of each division that issues an 8 9 occupational or professional license to ensure proper 10 application of this Section. At the end of each calendar year, 11 the military liaison shall provide an annual report 12 documenting the expedited licensure program for service 13 members and spouses, and shall deliver that report to the Secretary of Financial and Professional Regulation and the 14 15 Lieutenant Governor.

16 (b) Each director of a department that issues an 17 occupational or professional license is authorized to and shall issue an expedited license to a service member who meets 18 the requirements under this Section. Review and determination 19 20 of an application for a license issued by the department shall 21 be expedited by the department within 30 days after the date on 22 which the department receives all necessary documentation 23 required for licensure, including any required information from State and federal agencies. An expedited license shall be 24 25 issued by the department to any service members meeting the 26 application requirements of this Section, regardless of

whether the service member currently resides in this State.
The service member shall apply to the department on forms
provided by the department. An application must include proof
that:

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(1) the applicant is a service member;

6 (2) the applicant holds a valid license in good 7 standing for the occupation or profession issued by 8 another state, commonwealth, possession, or territory of 9 the United States, the District of Columbia, or any 10 foreign jurisdiction;

11 (2.5) the applicant meets the requirements and 12 standards for licensure through endorsement or reciprocity 13 for the occupation or profession for which the applicant 14 is applying;

(3) the applicant is assigned to a duty station in
this State, has established legal residence in this State,
or will reside in this State within 6 months after the date
of application for licensure;

19 (4) a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints has 20 been submitted to the Illinois State Police for statewide 21 and national criminal history checks, if applicable to the 22 requirements of the department issuing the license; the 23 applicant shall pay the fee to the Illinois State Police 24 or to the fingerprint vendor for electronic fingerprint 25 processing; no temporary occupational or professional 26 license shall be issued to an applicant if the statewide

or national criminal history check discloses information that would cause the denial of an application for licensure under any applicable occupational or professional licensing Act;

5 (5) the applicant is not ineligible for licensure 6 pursuant to Section 2105-165 of the Civil Administrative 7 Code of Illinois; and

8 (6) the applicant has submitted an application for 9 full licensure<u>.; and</u>

10 (7) the applicant has paid the required fee; fees
11 shall not be refundable.

12 Each director of a department that (C) issues an 13 occupational or professional license is authorized to and 14 shall issue an expedited license to the spouse of a service 15 member who meets the requirements under this Section. Review 16 and determination of an application for a license shall be 17 expedited by the department within 30 days after the date on which the department receives all necessary documentation 18 required for licensure, including information from State and 19 20 federal agencies. An expedited license shall be issued by the department to any spouse of a service member meeting the 21 22 application requirements of this Section, regardless of 23 whether the spouse or the service member currently resides in this State. The spouse of a service member shall apply to the 24 25 department on forms provided by the department. An application 26 must include proof that:

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(1) the applicant is the spouse of a service member; (2) the applicant holds a valid license in good 2 3 standing for the occupation or profession issued by another state, commonwealth, possession, or territory of 4 5 the United States, the District of Columbia, or any 6 foreign jurisdiction;

7 (2.5) the applicant meets the requirements and standards for licensure through endorsement or reciprocity 8 9 for the occupation or profession for which the applicant 10 is applying;

11 (3) the applicant's spouse is assigned to a duty 12 station in this State, has established legal residence in this State, or will reside in this State within 6 months 13 14 after the date of application for licensure;

15 (4) a complete set of the applicant's fingerprints has been submitted to the Illinois State Police for statewide 16 17 and national criminal history checks, if applicable to the requirements of the department issuing the license; the 18 19 applicant shall pay the fee to the Illinois State Police 20 or to the fingerprint vendor for electronic fingerprint 21 processing; no temporary occupational or professional 22 license shall be issued to an applicant if the statewide 23 or national criminal history check discloses information 24 that would cause the denial of an application for 25 licensure under applicable occupational any or 26 professional licensing Act;

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(5) the applicant is not ineligible for licensure
 pursuant to Section 2105-165 of the Civil Administrative
 Code of Illinois; and

4 (6) the applicant has submitted an application for
5 full licensure.; and

6 (7) the applicant has paid the required fee; fees
7 shall not be refundable.

(c-5) If a service member or his or her spouse relocates 8 9 from this State, he or she shall be provided an opportunity to 10 place his or her license in inactive status through 11 coordination with the military liaison. If the service member 12 or his or her spouse returns to this State, he or she may 13 reactivate the license in accordance with the statutory provisions regulating the profession and any applicable 14 administrative rules. The license reactivation shall be 15 16 expedited and completed within 30 days after receipt of a 17 completed application to reactivate the license. A license reactivation is only applicable when the valid license for 18 which the first issuance of a license was predicated is still 19 20 valid and in good standing. An application to reactivate a license must include proof that the applicant still holds a 21 22 valid license in good standing for the occupation or 23 profession issued in another State, commonwealth, possession, or territory of the United States, the District of Columbia, 24 25 or any foreign jurisdiction.

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(d) All relevant experience of a service member or his or

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her spouse in the discharge of official duties, including 1 2 full-time and part-time experience, shall be credited in the calculation of any years of practice in an occupation or 3 may be required under any applicable 4 profession as 5 occupational or professional licensing Act. All relevant 6 training provided by the military and completed by a service member shall be credited to that service member as meeting any 7 8 training or education requirement under any applicable 9 occupational or professional licensing Act, provided that the 10 training or education is determined by the department to meet 11 the requirements under any applicable Act and is not otherwise 12 contrary to any other licensure requirement.

13 (d-5) A department shall waive any application, 14 examination, or licensure fee for a service member or the 15 service member's spouse under this Section.

(e) A department may adopt any rules necessary for the
implementation and administration of this Section and shall by
rule provide for fees for the administration of this Section.
