SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act 725 ILCS 5/115-10.5a new

Creates the Law Enforcement Gang Database Information Act. Defines terms. Provides requirements for the use of gang databases and shared gang databases. Amends the Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963. Provides that in all criminal cases, evidence which indicates the mere presence that the person was or is on a gang database or a shared gang database is not admissible. Effective immediately.

AN ACT concerning criminal law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Law
Enforcement Gang Database Information Act.

6 Section 5. Definitions. In this Act:

7 "Gang" has the same meaning ascribed to the term in 8 Section 10 of the Illinois Streetgang Terrorism Omnibus 9 Prevention Act.

"Gang database" means any database, or data maintained in 10 11 multiple databases accessed by a law enforcement agency with 12 the primary purpose to designate a person as an associate or 13 alleged member of a gang, streetgang, or organization defined 14 in Section 10 of the Illinois Streetgang Terrorism Omnibus Prevention Act, or includes or points to information, 15 16 including, but not limited to, fact-based or uncorroborated 17 information, that reflects a designation of that person as a gang member, not including law enforcement agency case 18 19 reports, dispatching notes, or dispatch system records.

20 "Gang member" has the same meaning ascribed to the term in 21 Section 10 of the Illinois Streetgang Terrorism Omnibus 22 Prevention Act.

"Law enforcement agency" means an agency of this State or

1 unit of local government that is primarily responsible for the 2 detection, investigation, or prevention of crime and the 3 enforcement of the criminal laws of this State.

4 "Shared gang database" means a gang database that is
5 accessed by an agency or person outside of the agency that
6 created the records that populate the database.

7 Section 10. Requirements for use of gang databases and shared gang databases. Each law enforcement agency that 8 9 maintains a gang database or has access to a shared gang 10 database shall have a policy regarding those databases. Each 11 policy shall be implemented on or before July 1, 2023, except 12 the requirements in paragraph (1) shall be implemented as soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act. The 13 14 policy shall include, but not be limited to:

15 (1)that personnel authorized to access a qanq 16 database or shared gang database are limited to sworn law enforcement personnel, non-sworn law enforcement support 17 18 personnel, criminal justice entities, or non-criminal 19 justice technical or maintenance personnel, including information technology and information security staff and 20 21 contract employees, who have been subject to character or 22 security clearance and who have received approved 23 training;

enforcement agency case report, gang-related information 1 2 in a law enforcement agency dispatch note, or gang-related 3 information in a law enforcement agency dispatch system record shall not be disclosed for the following purposes: 4 5 employment, education, licensing, or housing, except that law enforcement and criminal justice entities may use 6 information contained in a gang database or shared gang 7 8 database for employment purposes, and records contained in 9 a gang database or shared gang database may be disclosed 10 to comply with federal law, for national security or 11 homeland security purposes, for military screening 12 purposes, or for other appropriate law enforcement 13 purpose;

15 (4) the review and purge process from gang databases16 and shared gang databases.

Section 105. The Code of Criminal Procedure of 1963 is amended by adding Section 115-10.5a as follows:

(a) In this Section, "gang database", "gang member", and

2 (b) In all criminal cases, evidence which indicates the 3 mere presence that the person was or is on a gang database or a 4 shared gang database is not admissible.

5 Section 999. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon6 becoming law.
