SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 605/605-1110 new

Amends the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law. Provides that the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity shall create a Youth Sports Referee Program to provide improved compensation and protections to referees employed by youth sports leagues. Provides that the Program shall: (1) develop standards that protect referees by authorizing them to eject disruptive spectators, including parents, from the premises of a sporting event held by a youth sports league; and (2) provide grants to youth sports leagues that adopt the standards to compensate referees at least \$50 per game officiated. Provides that the Department may adopt any rules necessary to administer the program.

1 AN ACT concerning State government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by adding Section 605-1110 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 605/605-1110 new)
- 8 Sec. 605-1110. Youth Sports Referee Program.
- 9 (a) As used in this Section:
- "Referee" means a person who officiates at a sponsored

 youth sports activity, such as a referee or umpire, including,

 but not limited to, persons enrolled as game officials by the
- 13 <u>Illinois High School Association</u>, the Illinois Elementary
- School Association, or a youth sports league.
- "Youth sports league" means any incorporated or

 unincorporated, for-profit or not-for-profit entity that

 organizes and provides sponsored youth sports activities,

 including, but not limited to, any athletic association,
- 19 organization, or federation in this State that is owned,
- 20 operated, sanctioned, or sponsored by a unit of local
- 21 government or that is owned, operated, sanctioned, or
- sponsored by a private person or entity, as well as any amateur
- 23 athletic organization or qualified amateur sports organization

3	(b) The Department shall create a Youth Sports Referee
4	Program to provide improved compensation and protections to
5	referees employed by youth sports league. The Program shall:

9	youth sports league; and
10	(2) provide grants to youth sports leagues that adopt
