2	AMENDMENT NO Amend House Bill 3578 by replacing
3	everything after the enacting clause with the following:
4 5	"Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Sections 3-606, 3-606.1, and 3-610.1 as follows:
6	(625 ILCS 5/3-606) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 3-606)
7	Sec. 3-606. Members of General Assembly. Upon receipt of a
8	request of a member of the General Assembly, accompanied by
9	the appropriate application and fee, the Secretary of State
10	shall issue to the member 2 plates as described in this
11	Section. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, if If
12	the member so requests, the Secretary shall issue 2 identical
13	sets of such registration plates for use on 2 different motor
14	vehicles. A member may request that the Secretary of State
15	issue registration plates in the name of a corporation when
16	the corporation owns or leases the vehicle to be registered

1 and the member is an officer or director of that corporation. Such registration plates shall be issued for a 2-year period 2 beginning January 1 of each odd-numbered year and ending 3 4 December 31 of the subsequent even-numbered year. If the 5 application is from a member of the Senate, there shall appear on the rear plate, in addition to the designation of the State 6 and the year for which the license was issued, the word 7 8 "official" and appropriate wording or abbreviation indicating that the holder is a member of the Senate, followed by the 9 10 number of the senatorial district of the member. On the front 11 plate, there shall appear appropriate wording or abbreviation indicating that the holder is a member of the Senate. If the 12 13 application is from a member of the House of Representatives, 14 there shall appear on the rear plate, in addition to the 15 designation of the State and the year for which the license was 16 issued, the word "official" and appropriate wording or abbreviation indicating that the holder is a member of the 17 House of Representatives, followed by the number assigned to 18 19 the member. On the front plate, there shall appear appropriate 20 wording or abbreviation indicating that the holder is a member 21 of the House of Representatives. Numbers 1 through 118 shall 22 be assigned and members with the longest length of service as 23 members of the legislature shall be given the lower numbers.

When members have an equal length of service, the lower numbers shall be given in alphabetical order based on surnames.

2	defined under Section 1-159.1 may request one set of
3	specialized plates which display the International Symbol of
4	Access and shall be subject to the provisions within Section
5	3-616. The set of specialized plates displaying the
6	International Symbol of Access shall only be issued along with
7	the assignment of a corresponding disability placard that must
8	be displayed in the vehicle. The surviving spouse of the
9	member shall not be entitled to retain this plate.

12 Sec. 3-606.1. Retired members of the General Assembly. Upon receipt of a request from a retired member of the General 13 14 Assembly, accompanied by the appropriate application and fee, 15 the Secretary of State shall issue to such retired member plates bearing appropriate wording or abbreviations indicating 16 that the holder is a retired member of the General Assembly. 17 Such plates may be issued for a 2 year period beginning January 18 19 1st of each odd-numbered year and ending December 31st of the subsequent even-numbered year. Except as otherwise provided in 20 21 this Section, upon Upon the death of a retired member who has 22 been issued a retired member of the General Assembly plate, 23 that member's surviving spouse shall be entitled to retain the 24 plate so long as the surviving spouse is a resident of Illinois 25 and transfers the registration to his or her name within 90 1

days of the death of the retired member.

A retired member of the General Assembly who has a 2 disability as defined under Section 1-159.1 may request one 3 4 set of specialized plates which display the International 5 Symbol of Access and shall be subject to the provisions within Section 3-616. The set of specialized plates displaying the 6 International Symbol of Access shall only be issued along with 7 the assignment of a corresponding disability placard that must 8 9 be displayed in the vehicle. The surviving spouse of the 10 retired member shall not be entitled to retain this plate.

11 "Retired member" means any individual who (a) has served as a member of the General Assembly for a minimum of 6 years, 12 13 or (b) is 62 or older, has served as a member of the General 14 Assembly for a minimum of 4 years, and retired prior to the 15 convening of the 83rd General Assembly.

16 The fees and procedures relating to such plates for retired members of the General Assembly shall be the same as 17 the fees and procedures applicable to personalized plates 18 issued under this Code. 19

1 Secretary of State shall issue to the retired member special plates bearing 2 registration appropriate wordina or abbreviations indicating that the holder is a retired member 3 4 of the Illinois congressional delegation. The plates may be 5 issued for a 2 year period beginning January 1st of each 6 odd-numbered year and ending December 31st of the subsequent 7 even-numbered year.

An applicant shall be charged a \$15 fee for original issuance in addition to the applicable registration fee. This additional fee shall be deposited into the Secretary of State Special License Plate Fund. For each registration renewal period, a \$2 fee, in addition to the appropriate registration fee, shall be charged and shall be deposited into the Retired Members of the Illinois Congressional Delegation Fund.

15 A retired member of the Illinois Congressional delegation who has a disability as defined under Section 1-159.1 may 16 request one set of specialized plates which display the 17 International Symbol of Access and shall be subject to the 18 provisions within Section 3-616. The set of specialized plates 19 20 displaying the International Symbol of Access shall only be issued along with the assignment of a corresponding disability 21 22 placard that must be displayed in the vehicle. The surviving spouse of the retired member shall not be entitled to retain 23 24 this plate.

25 "Retired member of the Illinois congressional delegation"
26 means any individual who has served as a member of the U.S.

Senate or U.S. House of Representatives representing the State
 of Illinois. The term does not include an individual who is
 serving in the U.S. Senate or U.S. House of Representatives.
