Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- (5) disseminate the crisis standards of care plan among healthcare providers and facilities, emergency management officials, public safety communities, and other stakeholders, including, but not limited to, disseminating information about, and gathering feedback on, the emergency medical disaster plan, including gathering general information and data, assessing regional needs, perspectives, specific capabilities and potential challenges, to ensure a structured, ethical, culturally sensitive, and integrated framework and approach to equitable distribution of resources during public health emergencies.
- (c) The Department may adopt rules necessary to implement this Section.
