1 AMENDMENT TO HOUSE BILL 3965

2 AMENDMENT NO. _____. Amend House Bill 3965 by replacing
3 everything after the enacting clause with the following:

4 "Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing
5 Sections 7-10, 8-8, and 10-5 and by adding Section 1-23 as
6 follows:

7 (10 ILCS 5/1-23 new)

8 Sec. 1-23. Candidate email address. Each election
9 authority shall require any candidate for any elective office
10 in this State to provide an email address for the candidate in
11 the candidate's petition for nomination or statement of
12 candidacy.

13 (10 ILCS 5/7-10) (from Ch. 46, par. 7-10)

14 Sec. 7-10. Form of petition for nomination. The name of no
15 candidate for nomination, or State central committeeperson, or

1 township committeeperson, or precinct committeeperson, or ward
 2 committeeperson or candidate for delegate or alternate
 3 delegate to national nominating conventions, shall be printed
 4 upon the primary ballot unless a petition for nomination has
 5 been filed in his behalf as provided in this Article in
 6 substantially the following form:

7 We, the undersigned, members of and affiliated with the
 8 party and qualified primary electors of the party,
 9 in the of, in the county of and State of
 10 Illinois, do hereby petition that the following named person
 11 or persons shall be a candidate or candidates of the party
 12 for the nomination for (or in case of committeepersons for
 13 election to) the office or offices hereinafter specified, to
 14 be voted for at the primary election to be held on (insert

12 Each sheet of the petition other than the statement of
 13 candidacy and candidate's statement shall be of uniform size
 14 and shall contain above the space for signatures an
 15 appropriate heading giving the information as to name of
 16 candidate or candidates, in whose behalf such petition is
 17 signed; the office, the political party represented and place
 18 of residence; and the heading of each sheet shall be the same.

19 Such petition shall be signed by qualified primary
 20 electors residing in the political division for which the
 21 nomination is sought in their own proper persons only and
 22 opposite the signature of each signer, his residence address
 23 shall be written or printed. The residence address required to
 24 be written or printed opposite each qualified primary
 25 elector's name shall include the street address or rural route

1 number of the signer, as the case may be, as well as the
2 signer's county, and city, village or town, and state.
3 However, the county or city, village or town, and state of
4 residence of the electors may be printed on the petition forms
5 where all of the electors signing the petition reside in the
6 same county or city, village or town, and state. Standard
7 abbreviations may be used in writing the residence address,
8 including street number, if any. At the bottom of each sheet of
9 such petition shall be added a circulator statement signed by
10 a person 18 years of age or older who is a citizen of the
11 United States, stating the street address or rural route
12 number, as the case may be, as well as the county, city,
13 village or town, and state; and certifying that the signatures
14 on that sheet of the petition were signed in his or her
15 presence and certifying that the signatures are genuine; and
16 either (1) indicating the dates on which that sheet was
17 circulated, or (2) indicating the first and last dates on
18 which the sheet was circulated, or (3) for elections where the
19 petition circulation period is 90 days, certifying that none
20 of the signatures on the sheet were signed more than 90 days
21 preceding the last day for the filing of the petition, or (4)
22 for the 2022 general primary election only, certify that the
23 signatures on the sheet were signed during the period of
24 January 13, 2022 through March 14, 2022 or certify that the
25 signatures on the sheet were signed during the period of
26 January 13, 2022 through the date on which this statement was

1 sworn or affirmed to and certifying that to the best of his or
2 her knowledge and belief the persons so signing were at the
3 time of signing the petitions qualified voters of the
4 political party for which a nomination is sought. Such
5 statement shall be sworn to before some officer authorized to
6 administer oaths in this State.

7 Except as otherwise provided in this Code, no petition
8 sheet shall be circulated more than 90 days preceding the last
9 day provided in Section 7-12 for the filing of such petition.

10 The person circulating the petition, or the candidate on
11 whose behalf the petition is circulated, may strike any
12 signature from the petition, provided that:

13 (1) the person striking the signature shall initial
14 the petition at the place where the signature is struck;
15 and

16 (2) the person striking the signature shall sign a
17 certification listing the page number and line number of
18 each signature struck from the petition. Such
19 certification shall be filed as a part of the petition.

20 Such sheets before being filed shall be neatly fastened
21 together in book form, by placing the sheets in a pile and
22 fastening them together at one edge in a secure and suitable
23 manner, and the sheets shall then be numbered consecutively.
24 The sheets shall not be fastened by pasting them together end
25 to end, so as to form a continuous strip or roll. All petition
26 sheets which are filed with the proper local election

1 officials, election authorities or the State Board of
2 Elections shall be the original sheets which have been signed
3 by the voters and by the circulator thereof, and not
4 photocopies or duplicates of such sheets. Each petition must
5 include as a part thereof, a statement of candidacy for each of
6 the candidates filing, or in whose behalf the petition is
7 filed. This statement shall set out the address of such
8 candidate, an email address for the candidate, the office for
9 which he is a candidate, shall state that the candidate is a
10 qualified primary voter of the party to which the petition
11 relates and is qualified for the office specified (in the case
12 of a candidate for State's Attorney it shall state that the
13 candidate is at the time of filing such statement a licensed
14 attorney-at-law of this State), shall state that he has filed
15 (or will file before the close of the petition filing period) a
16 statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois
17 Governmental Ethics Act, shall request that the candidate's
18 name be placed upon the official ballot, and shall be
19 subscribed and sworn to by such candidate before some officer
20 authorized to take acknowledgment of deeds in the State and
21 shall be in substantially the following form:

2 The petitions, when filed, shall not be withdrawn or added
3 to, and no signatures shall be revoked except by revocation
4 filed in writing with the State Board of Elections, election
5 authority or local election official with whom the petition is
6 required to be filed, and before the filing of such petition.
7 Whoever forges the name of a signer upon any petition required
8 by this Article is deemed guilty of a forgery and on conviction
9 thereof shall be punished accordingly.

10 A candidate for the offices listed in this Section must
11 obtain the number of signatures specified in this Section on
12 his or her petition for nomination.

13 (a) Statewide office or delegate to a national nominating
14 convention. Except as otherwise provided in this Code, if a
15 candidate seeks to run for statewide office or as a delegate or
16 alternate delegate to a national nominating convention elected
17 from the State at-large, then the candidate's petition for
18 nomination must contain at least 5,000 but not more than
19 10,000 signatures.

20 (b) Congressional office or congressional delegate to a
21 national nominating convention. Except as otherwise provided
22 in this Code, if a candidate seeks to run for United States
23 Congress or as a congressional delegate or alternate
24 congressional delegate to a national nominating convention
25 elected from a congressional district, then the candidate's

1 petition for nomination must contain at least the number of
2 signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of
3 his or her party in his or her congressional district. In the
4 first primary election following a redistricting of
5 congressional districts, a candidate's petition for nomination
6 must contain at least 600 signatures of qualified primary
7 electors of the candidate's political party in his or her
8 congressional district.

9 (c) County office. Except as otherwise provided in this
10 Code, if a candidate seeks to run for any countywide office,
11 including, but not limited to, county board chairperson or
12 county board member, elected on an at-large basis, in a county
13 other than Cook County, then the candidate's petition for
14 nomination must contain at least the number of signatures
15 equal to 0.5% of the qualified electors of his or her party who
16 cast votes at the last preceding general election in his or her
17 county. If a candidate seeks to run for county board member
18 elected from a county board district, then the candidate's
19 petition for nomination must contain at least the number of
20 signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of
21 his or her party in the county board district. In the first
22 primary election following a redistricting of county board
23 districts or the initial establishment of county board
24 districts, a candidate's petition for nomination must contain
25 at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the
26 qualified electors of his or her party in the entire county who

1 cast votes at the last preceding general election divided by
2 the total number of county board districts comprising the
3 county board; provided that in no event shall the number of
4 signatures be less than 25.

5 (d) County office; Cook County only.

6 (1) If a candidate seeks to run for countywide office
7 in Cook County, then the candidate's petition for
8 nomination must contain at least the number of signatures
9 equal to 0.5% of the qualified electors of his or her party
10 who cast votes at the last preceding general election in
11 Cook County.

12 (2) If a candidate seeks to run for Cook County Board
13 Commissioner, then the candidate's petition for nomination
14 must contain at least the number of signatures equal to
15 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of his or her party
16 in his or her county board district. In the first primary
17 election following a redistricting of Cook County Board of
18 Commissioners districts, a candidate's petition for
19 nomination must contain at least the number of signatures
20 equal to 0.5% of the qualified electors of his or her party
21 in the entire county who cast votes at the last preceding
22 general election divided by the total number of county
23 board districts comprising the county board; provided that
24 in no event shall the number of signatures be less than 25.

25 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this Code, if a
26 candidate seeks to run for Cook County Board of Review

1 Commissioner, which is elected from a district pursuant to
2 subsection (c) of Section 5-5 of the Property Tax Code,
3 then the candidate's petition for nomination must contain
4 at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the
5 total number of registered voters in his or her board of
6 review district in the last general election at which a
7 commissioner was regularly scheduled to be elected from
8 that board of review district. In no event shall the
9 number of signatures required be greater than the
10 requisite number for a candidate who seeks countywide
11 office in Cook County under subsection (d)(1) of this
12 Section. In the first primary election following a
13 redistricting of Cook County Board of Review districts, a
14 candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least
15 4,000 signatures or at least the number of signatures
16 required for a countywide candidate in Cook County,
17 whichever is less, of the qualified electors of his or her
18 party in the district.

19 (e) Municipal or township office. If a candidate seeks to
20 run for municipal or township office, then the candidate's
21 petition for nomination must contain at least the number of
22 signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified primary electors of
23 his or her party in the municipality or township. If a
24 candidate seeks to run for alderperson of a municipality, then
25 the candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least
26 the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the qualified

1 primary electors of his or her party of the ward. In the first
2 primary election following redistricting of wards or trustee
3 districts of a municipality or the initial establishment of
4 wards or districts, a candidate's petition for nomination must
5 contain the number of signatures equal to at least 0.5% of the
6 total number of votes cast for the candidate of that political
7 party who received the highest number of votes in the entire
8 municipality at the last regular election at which an officer
9 was regularly scheduled to be elected from the entire
10 municipality, divided by the number of wards or districts. In
11 no event shall the number of signatures be less than 25.

12 (f) State central committeeperson. If a candidate seeks to
13 run for State central committeeperson, then the candidate's
14 petition for nomination must contain at least 100 signatures
15 of the primary electors of his or her party of his or her
16 congressional district.

17 (g) Sanitary district trustee. Except as otherwise
18 provided in this Code, if a candidate seeks to run for trustee
19 of a sanitary district in which trustees are not elected from
20 wards, then the candidate's petition for nomination must
21 contain at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the
22 primary electors of his or her party from the sanitary
23 district. If a candidate seeks to run for trustee of a sanitary
24 district in which trustees are elected from wards, then the
25 candidate's petition for nomination must contain at least the
26 number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the primary electors of

1 his or her party in the ward of that sanitary district. In the
2 first primary election following redistricting of sanitary
3 districts elected from wards, a candidate's petition for
4 nomination must contain at least the signatures of 150
5 qualified primary electors of his or her ward of that sanitary
6 district.

7 (h) Judicial office. Except as otherwise provided in this
8 Code, if a candidate seeks to run for judicial office in a
9 district, then the candidate's petition for nomination must
10 contain the number of signatures equal to 0.4% of the number of
11 votes cast in that district for the candidate for his or her
12 political party for the office of Governor at the last general
13 election at which a Governor was elected, but in no event less
14 than 500 signatures. If a candidate seeks to run for judicial
15 office in a circuit or subcircuit, then the candidate's
16 petition for nomination must contain the number of signatures
17 equal to 0.25% of the number of votes cast for the judicial
18 candidate of his or her political party who received the
19 highest number of votes at the last general election at which a
20 judicial officer from the same circuit or subcircuit was
21 regularly scheduled to be elected, but in no event less than
22 1,000 signatures in circuits and subcircuits located in the
23 First Judicial District or 500 signatures in every other
24 Judicial District.

25 (i) Precinct, ward, and township committeeperson. Except
26 as otherwise provided in this Code, if a candidate seeks to run

1 for precinct committeeperson, then the candidate's petition
2 for nomination must contain at least 10 signatures of the
3 primary electors of his or her party for the precinct. If a
4 candidate seeks to run for ward committeeperson, then the
5 candidate's petition for nomination must contain no less than
6 the number of signatures equal to 10% of the primary electors
7 of his or her party of the ward, but no more than 16% of those
8 same electors; provided that the maximum number of signatures
9 may be 50 more than the minimum number, whichever is greater.
10 If a candidate seeks to run for township committeeperson, then
11 the candidate's petition for nomination must contain no less
12 than the number of signatures equal to 5% of the primary
13 electors of his or her party of the township, but no more than
14 8% of those same electors; provided that the maximum number of
15 signatures may be 50 more than the minimum number, whichever
16 is greater.

17 (j) State's attorney or regional superintendent of schools
18 for multiple counties. If a candidate seeks to run for State's
19 attorney or regional Superintendent of Schools who serves more
20 than one county, then the candidate's petition for nomination
21 must contain at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of
22 the primary electors of his or her party in the territory
23 comprising the counties.

24 (k) Any other office. If a candidate seeks any other
25 office, then the candidate's petition for nomination must
26 contain at least the number of signatures equal to 0.5% of the

1 registered voters of the political subdivision, district, or
2 division for which the nomination is made or 25 signatures,
3 whichever is greater.

4 For purposes of this Section the number of primary
5 electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast, in
6 the applicable district, for the candidate for that political
7 party who received the highest number of votes, statewide, at
8 the last general election in the State at which electors for
9 President of the United States were elected. For political
10 subdivisions, the number of primary electors shall be
11 determined by taking the total vote cast for the candidate for
12 that political party who received the highest number of votes
13 in the political subdivision at the last regular election at
14 which an officer was regularly scheduled to be elected from
15 that subdivision. For wards or districts of political
16 subdivisions, the number of primary electors shall be
17 determined by taking the total vote cast for the candidate for
18 that political party who received the highest number of votes
19 in the ward or district at the last regular election at which
20 an officer was regularly scheduled to be elected from that
21 ward or district.

22 A "qualified primary elector" of a party may not sign
23 petitions for or be a candidate in the primary of more than one
24 party.

25 The changes made to this Section by Public Act 93-574 are
26 declarative of existing law, except for item (3) of subsection

1 (d).

2 Petitions of candidates for nomination for offices herein
3 specified, to be filed with the same officer, may contain the
4 names of 2 or more candidates of the same political party for
5 the same or different offices. In the case of the offices of
6 Governor and Lieutenant Governor, a joint petition including
7 one candidate for each of those offices must be filed.

11 Sec. 8-8. Form of petition for nomination. The name of no
12 candidate for nomination shall be printed upon the primary
13 ballot unless a petition for nomination shall have been filed
14 in his behalf as provided for in this Section. Each such
15 petition shall include as a part thereof the oath required by
16 Section 7-10.1 of this Code Act and a statement of candidacy by
17 the candidate filing or in whose behalf the petition is filed.
18 This statement shall set out the address of such candidate, an
19 email address for the candidate, and the office for which he
20 is a candidate; ; shall state that the candidate is a qualified
21 primary voter of the party to which the petition relates, is
22 qualified for the office specified, ; and has filed a statement
23 of economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental
24 Ethics Act; ; shall request that the candidate's name be placed
25 upon the official ballot; ; and shall be subscribed and sworn by

1 such candidate before some officer authorized to take
2 acknowledgment of deeds in this State and may be in

1 Except as otherwise provided in this Code, all petitions
2 for nomination for the office of State Senator shall be signed
3 by at least 1,000 but not more than 3,000 of the qualified
4 primary electors of the candidate's party in his legislative
5 district.

6 Except as otherwise provided in this Code, all petitions
7 for nomination for the office of Representative in the General
8 Assembly shall be signed by at least 500 but not more than
9 1,500 of the qualified primary electors of the candidate's
10 party in his or her representative district.

11 Opposite the signature of each qualified primary elector
12 who signs a petition for nomination for the office of State
13 Representative or State Senator such elector's residence
14 address shall be written or printed. The residence address
15 required to be written or printed opposite each qualified
16 primary elector's name shall include the street address or
17 rural route number of the signer, as the case may be, as well
18 as the signer's county and city, village, or town.

19 For the purposes of this Section, the number of primary
20 electors shall be determined by taking the total vote cast, in
21 the applicable district, for the candidate for such political
22 party who received the highest number of votes, state-wide, at
23 the last general election in the State at which electors for
24 President of the United States were elected.

25 A "qualified primary elector" of a party may not sign
26 petitions for or be a candidate in the primary of more than one

1 party.

2 In the affidavit at the bottom of each sheet, the petition
3 circulator, who shall be a person 18 years of age or older who
4 is a citizen of the United States, shall state his or her
5 street address or rural route number, as the case may be, as
6 well as his or her county, city, village or town, and state;
7 and shall certify that the signatures on that sheet of the
8 petition were signed in his or her presence; and shall certify
9 that the signatures are genuine; and shall certify that, to
10 the best of his or her knowledge and belief, the persons so
11 signing were at the time of signing the petition qualified
12 primary voters for which the nomination is sought.

13 In the affidavit at the bottom of each petition sheet, the
14 petition circulator shall ~~either~~ (1) indicate the dates on
15 which he or she circulated that sheet, or (2) indicate the
16 first and last dates on which the sheet was circulated, or (3)
17 for elections where the petition circulation period is 90
18 days, certify that none of the signatures on the sheet were
19 signed more than 90 days preceding the last day for the filing
20 of the petition, or (4) for the 2022 general primary election
21 only, certify that the signatures on the sheet were signed
22 during the period of January 13, 2022 through March 14, 2022 or
23 certify that the signatures on the sheet were signed during
24 the period of January 13, 2022 through the date on which this
25 statement was sworn or affirmed to. No petition sheet shall be
26 circulated more than 90 days preceding the last day provided

1 in Section 8-9 for the filing of such petition.

2 All petition sheets which are filed with the State Board
3 of Elections shall be the original sheets which have been
4 signed by the voters and by the circulator, and not
5 photocopies or duplicates of such sheets.

6 The person circulating the petition, or the candidate on
7 whose behalf the petition is circulated, may strike any
8 signature from the petition, provided that:

9 (1) the person striking the signature shall initial
10 the petition at the place where the signature is struck;
11 and

12 (2) the person striking the signature shall sign a
13 certification listing the page number and line number of
14 each signature struck from the petition. Such
15 certification shall be filed as a part of the petition.

19 Sec. 10-5. All petitions for nomination shall, besides
20 containing the names of candidates, specify as to each:

21 1. The office or offices to which such candidate or
22 candidates shall be nominated.

23 2. The new political party, if any, represented, expressed
24 in not more than 5 words. However, such party shall not bear
25 the same name as, nor include the name of any established

1 political party as defined in this Article. This prohibition
2 does not preclude any established political party from making
3 nominations in those cases in which it is authorized to do so.

4 3. The place of residence of any such candidate or
5 candidates with the street and number thereof, if any. In the
6 case of electors for President and Vice-President of the
7 United States, the names of candidates for President and
8 Vice-President may be added to the party name or appellation.

9 Such certificate of nomination or nomination papers in
10 addition shall include as a part thereof, the oath required by
11 Section 7-10.1 of this Act and must include a statement of
12 candidacy for each of the candidates named therein, except
13 candidates for electors for President and Vice-President of
14 the United States. Each such statement shall set out the
15 address of such candidate, an email address for the candidate,
16 the office for which he is a candidate, shall state that the
17 candidate is qualified for the office specified and has filed
18 (or will file before the close of the petition filing period) a
19 statement of economic interests as required by the Illinois
20 Governmental Ethics Act, shall request that the candidate's
21 name be placed upon the official ballot and shall be
22 subscribed and sworn to by such candidate before some officer
23 authorized to take acknowledgments of deeds in this State, and
24 may be in substantially the following form:

21 of the party officers authorized to fill vacancies in
22 nomination pursuant to Section 10-11.

23 Nomination papers filed under this Section are not valid
24 if the candidate named therein fails to file a statement of
25 economic interests as required by the Illinois Governmental
26 Ethics Act in relation to his candidacy with the appropriate

1 officer by the end of the period for the filing of nomination
2 papers unless he has filed a statement of economic interests
3 in relation to the same governmental unit with that officer
4 during the same calendar year as the year in which such
5 nomination papers were filed. If the nomination papers of any
6 candidate and the statement of economic interest of that
7 candidate are not required to be filed with the same officer,
8 the candidate must file with the officer with whom the
9 nomination papers are filed a receipt from the officer with
10 whom the statement of economic interests is filed showing the
11 date on which such statement was filed. Such receipt shall be
12 so filed not later than the last day on which nomination papers
13 may be filed.

13 for the candidate in the candidate's petition for nomination
