4 Section 5. The Child Care Act of 1969 is amended by 5 changing Section 7.10 as follows:

6 (225 ILCS 10/7.10)

Sec. 7.10. <u>Licensing orientation program and progress</u>
8 Progress report.

9 (a) For the purposes of this Section, "child day care 10 licensing" or "day care licensing" means licensing of day care 11 centers, day care homes, and group day care homes.

12 (a-5) In addition to current daycare training and subject to appropriations, the Department or any State agency that 13 14 assumes day care center licensing responsibilities shall host licensing orientation programs to help educate potential day 15 16 care center, day care home, and group day care home providers 17 about the child day care licensing process. The programs shall be made available in person and virtually. The Department or 18 19 its successor shall offer to host licensing orientation programs at least twice annually in each Representative 20 21 District in the State. Additionally, if one or more persons 22 request that a program be offered in a language other than English, then the Department or its successor must accommodate 23

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1 the request.

2 (b) No later than September 30th of each year, the 3 Department shall provide the General Assembly with a comprehensive report on its progress in meeting performance 4 5 measures and goals related to child day care licensing. (c) The report shall include: 6 7 details on the funding for child day care (1)8 licensing, including: 9 (A) the total number of full-time employees 10 working on child day care licensing; (B) the names of all sources of revenue used to 11 12 support child day care licensing; 13 (C) the amount of expenditures that is claimed against federal funding sources; 14 (D) the identity of federal funding sources; and 15 16 (E) how funds are appropriated, including 17 for line staff, support appropriations staff, supervisory staff, and training and other expenses and 18 the funding history of such licensing since fiscal 19 20 year 2010; 21 current staffing qualifications of (2) day care 22 licensing representatives and day care licensing 23 supervisors in comparison with staffing qualifications specified in the job description; 24
