1 AN ACT concerning civil law.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
- 5 Uniform Cohabitants' Economic Remedies Act.
- 6 Section 2. Definitions. In this Act:
- 7 (1) "Cohabitant" means each of two individuals not married
- 8 to each other who live together as a couple after each has
- 9 reached the age of majority or been emancipated. The term does
- 10 not include individuals who are too closely related to marry
- 11 each other legally.
- 12 (2) "Cohabitants' agreement" means an agreement between
- two individuals concerning contributions to the relationship
- 14 if the individuals are to become, are, or were cohabitants.
- 15 The term includes a waiver of rights under this Act.
- 16 (3) "Contributions to the relationship" means
- 17 contributions of a cohabitant that benefit the other
- 18 cohabitant, both cohabitants, or the cohabitants'
- 19 relationship, in the form of efforts, activities, services, or
- 20 property. The term:
- 21 (A) includes:
- 22 (i) cooking, cleaning, shopping, household
- 23 maintenance, conducting errands, and other domestic

- (ii) otherwise caring for the other cohabitant, a child in common, or another family member of the other cohabitant; and
  - (B) does not include sexual relations.
- (4) "Property" means anything that may be the subject of ownership, whether real or personal, tangible or intangible, legal or equitable, or any interest therein. The term includes responsibility for a debt.
- (5) "Record" means information:
  - (A) inscribed on a tangible medium; or
- 13 (B) stored in an electronic or other medium and 14 retrievable in perceivable form.
- 15 (6) "State" means a state of the United States, the
  16 District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the United States Virgin
  17 Islands, or any other territory or possession subject to the
  18 jurisdiction of the United States.
- 19 (7) "Termination of cohabitation" means the earliest of:
- 20 (A) the death of a cohabitant;
- 21 (B) the date the cohabitants stop living together as a 22 couple; or
- 23 (C) the date of the cohabitants' marriage to each other.
- 25 Section 3. Scope. This Act applies only to a contractual

- or equitable claim between cohabitants concerning an interest, 1
- 2 promise, or obligation arising from contributions to the
- 3 relationship. The rights and remedies of cohabitants under
- this Act are not exclusive. A claim brought under this Act is
- 5 subject to any applicable affirmative defense, including, but
- 6 not limited to, the statute of frauds.
- 7 Section 4. Right of cohabitant to bring action.
- (a) An individual who is or was a cohabitant may commence 8
- 9 an action on a contractual or equitable claim that arises out
- 10 of contributions to the relationship. The action is not:
- 11 (1) barred because of a sexual relationship between
- 12 the cohabitants;
- (2) subject to additional substantive or procedural 1.3
- requirements because the parties to the action are or were 14
- 15 cohabitants or because of a sexual relationship between
- 16 the cohabitants; or
- (3) extinguished by the marriage of the cohabitants to 17
- 18 each other.
- (b) The action may be commenced on behalf of a deceased 19
- cohabitant's estate. 20
- 21 The action may be commenced against a deceased
- 22 cohabitant's estate and adjudicated under law of this state
- 23 applicable to a claim against a decedent's estate.
- 24 Section 5. Governing law.

- (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Act, a claim 1 2 under this Act is governed by other law of this state,
- including this state's choice-of-law rules. 3
- (b) The validity, enforceability, interpretation, and 5 construction of a cohabitants' agreement are determined by:
- 6 (1) the law of the state designated in the agreement 7 if the designation is valid under other law of this state; 8 or
- 9 (2) in the absence of a designation effective under 10 paragraph (1), the law of this state, including this state's choice-of-law rules. 11
- 12 Section 6. Cohabitants' agreement.
- 1.3 (a) A cohabitants' agreement may be oral, in a record, 14 express, or implied-in-fact.
- 15 (b) Contributions to the relationship are sufficient 16 consideration for a cohabitants' agreement.
- (c) A claim for breach of a cohabitants' agreement accrues 17 on breach and may be commenced, subject to Section 13-205 or 18 19 13-206 of the Code of Civil Procedure, during cohabitation or after termination of cohabitation. 20
- 21 (d) A term in a cohabitants' agreement that affects 22 adversely a child's right to support is unenforceable.
- (e) A term in a cohabitants' agreement that requires or 23 24 limits the ability of a cohabitant to pursue a civil, 25 criminal, or administrative remedy is voidable to the extent

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- 1 the remedy is available because the cohabitant is a victim of a
- 2 crime of violence, as defined in subsection (c) of Section 2 of
- 3 the Crime Victims Compensation Act.
- 4 Section 7. Equitable relief.
  - (a) Unless maintaining the action is inconsistent with a valid cohabitants' agreement, a cohabitant may commence an equitable action against the other cohabitant or the estate of the other cohabitant concerning entitlement to property or reimbursement based on contributions to the relationship. The action is in addition to any remedy otherwise available to the cohabitant under this Act or other law.
  - (b) An equitable claim based on contributions to the relationship accrues on termination of cohabitation and is subject to equitable defenses and may be commenced, subject to Section 13-205 of the Code of Civil Procedure, during cohabitation or after termination of cohabitation.
  - (c) In addition to other law governing an equitable claim, the court adjudicating a claim under this section shall consider:
    - (1) the nature and value of contributions to the relationship by each cohabitant, including the value to each cohabitant and the market value of the contributions;
      - (2) the duration and continuity of the cohabitation;
    - (3) the extent to which a cohabitant reasonably relied on representations or conduct of the other cohabitant;

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- 1 (4) the extent to which a cohabitant demonstrated an 2 intent to share, or not to share, property with the other 3 cohabitant; and
- 4 (5) other relevant factors.
- Section 8. Effect of court order or judgment on third party.
- 7 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c), a court order or 8 judgment granting relief under this Act against a cohabitant 9 or a cohabitant's estate is an order or judgment in favor of a unsecured creditor.
- 11 (b) A court order or judgment granting relief under this
  12 Act may not impair the rights of a good-faith purchaser from,
  13 or secured creditor of, a cohabitant.
  - (c) A court order or judgment granting relief under this Act may not impair the right or interest of a cohabitant's spouse or surviving spouse to the cohabitant's property and is subordinate to any domestic support obligation arising from a marriage of a cohabitant to another person.
- Section 9. Principles of law and equity. The principles of law and equity supplement this Act except to the extent inconsistent with this Act.
- Section 10. Uniformity of application and construction. In applying and construing this uniform Act, a court shall

- consider the promotion of uniformity of the law 1
- 2 jurisdictions that enact it.
- 3 Section 11. Relation to Electronic Signatures in Global
- 4 and National Commerce Act. This Act modifies, limits, or
- 5 supersedes the Electronic Signatures in Global and National
- 6 Commerce Act, 15 U.S.C. Section 7001 et seq., but does not
- 7 modify, limit, or supersede 15 U.S.C. Section 7001(c), or
- 8 authorize electronic delivery of any of the notices described
- in 15 U.S.C. Section 7003(b). 9
- 10 Section 12. Transitional provisions.
- 11 (a) This Act applies to a cohabitants' agreement made on
- or after the effective date of this Act. 12
- 13 (b) This Act applies to an equitable claim that is made
- 14 under this Act that accrues on or after the effective date of
- 15 this Act.
- Section 13. Severability. The provisions of this Act are 16
- severable under Section 1.31 of the Statute on Statutes. 17
