10	(a) The Secretary of State shall e	xamine every applicant
11	for a driver's license or permit who h	as not been previously
12	licensed as a driver under the laws of t	this State or any other
13	state or country, or any applicant	for renewal of such
14	driver's license or permit when such	license or permit has

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been expired for more than one year. The Secretary of State shall, subject to the provisions of paragraph (c), examine every licensed driver at least every 8 years, and may examine or re-examine any other applicant or licensed driver, provided that during the years 1984 through 1991 those drivers issued a license for 3 years may be re-examined not less than every 7 years or more than every 10 years.

8 The Secretary of State shall require the testing of the 9 eyesight of any driver's license or permit applicant who has 10 not been previously licensed as a driver under the laws of this 11 State and shall promulgate rules and regulations to provide 12 for the orderly administration of all the provisions of this 13 Section.

The Secretary of State shall include at least one test question that concerns the provisions of the Pedestrians with Disabilities Safety Act in the question pool used for the written portion of the driver's license examination within one year after July 22, 2010 (the effective date of Public Act 96-1167).

The Secretary of State shall include, in the question pool used for the written portion of the driver's license examination, test questions concerning safe driving in the presence of bicycles, of which one may be concerning the Dutch Reach method as described in Section 2-112.

examination, at least one test question concerning driver responsibilities when approaching a stationary emergency vehicle as described in Section 11-907.

4 (b) Except as provided for those applicants in paragraph 5 (c), such examination shall include a test of the applicant's eyesight, his or her ability to read and understand official 6 traffic control devices, his or her knowledge of safe driving 7 8 practices and the traffic laws of this State, and may include 9 an actual demonstration of the applicant's ability to exercise 10 ordinary and reasonable control of the operation of a motor 11 vehicle, and such further physical and mental examination as the Secretary of State finds necessary to determine the 12 13 applicant's fitness to operate a motor vehicle safely on the 14 highways, except the examination of an applicant 75 years of 15 age or older or, if the Secretary adopts rules under Section 37 16 of the Secretary of State Act to raise the age requirement for actual demonstrations, the examination of an applicant who has 17 attained that increased age or is older shall include an 18 actual demonstration of the applicant's ability to exercise 19 20 ordinary and reasonable control of the operation of a motor vehicle. All portions of written and verbal examinations under 21 22 this Section, excepting where the English language appears on 23 facsimiles of road signs, may be given in the Spanish language 24 and, at the discretion of the Secretary of State, in any other 25 language as well as in English upon request of the examinee. 26 Deaf persons who are otherwise qualified are not prohibited 10300HB4494ham001 -4- LRB103 36896 RTM 69958 a

from being issued a license, other than a commercial driver's 1 2 license, under this Code. The examination to test an 3 applicant's ability to read and understand official traffic control devices and knowledge of safe driving practices and 4 5 the traffic laws of this State may be administered at a Secretary of State facility, remotely via the Internet, or in 6 a manner otherwise specified by the Secretary of State in 7 8 administrative rule.

9 (c) Re-examination for those applicants who at the time of 10 renewing their driver's license possess a driving record 11 devoid of any convictions of traffic violations or evidence of committing an offense for which mandatory revocation would be 12 13 required upon conviction pursuant to Section 6-205 at the time 14 of renewal shall be in a manner prescribed by the Secretary in 15 order to determine an applicant's ability to safely operate a 16 motor vehicle, except that every applicant for the renewal of a driver's license who is 75 years of age or older or, if the 17 Secretary adopts rules under Section 37 of the Secretary of 18 19 State Act to raise the age requirement for actual 20 demonstrations, every applicant for the renewal of a driver's license who has attained that increased age or is older must 21 22 prove, by an actual demonstration, the applicant's ability to 23 exercise reasonable care in the safe operation of a motor 24 vehicle.

1 Secretary of State shall make provision for giving an 2 examination, either in the county where the applicant resides 3 or at a place adjacent thereto reasonably convenient to the 4 applicant, within not more than 30 days from the date said 5 application is received.

6 (e) The Secretary of State may adopt rules regarding the 7 use of foreign language interpreters during the application 8 and examination process.

Driving on certain pedestrian and bicycle 8 lanes, trails, and paths. (a) No person shall drive a motor vehicle on a pedestrian 9 or bicycle lane, trail, or path, designated by an official 10 11 sign or marking for the exclusive use of bicycles or pedestrians. A violation of this Section is not an offense 12 13 against traffic regulations governing the movement of 14 vehicles. (b) This Section does not apply to an authorized emergency 15 vehicle."; and 16 17 on page 121, immediately below line 9, by inserting the following: 18 19 "Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon

20 becoming law.".
