

103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 HB4811

Introduced 2/6/2024, by Rep. Patrick Windhorst

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/11-506

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that the driver's license of any person convicted of engaging in a street sideshow shall be revoked in the manner provided by the Code. Provides that every person convicted of engaging in a street sideshow shall be guilty of aggravated engaging in a street sideshow if the person, in committing the violation, was involved in a motor vehicle crash that resulted in great bodily harm or permanent disability or disfigurement to another, where the violation was a proximate cause of the injury. Provides that aggravated engaging in a street sideshow is a Class 4 felony for which the defendant, if sentenced to a term of imprisonment, shall be sentenced to not less than one year nor more than 12 years.

1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing Section 11-506 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/11-506)
- Sec. 11-506. Street racing; aggravated street racing;
- 8 street sideshows.
- 9 (a) No person shall engage in street racing on any street 10 or highway of this State.
- 11 (a-5) No person shall engage in a street sideshow on any 12 street or highway of this State.
- 13 (b) No owner of any vehicle shall acquiesce in or permit
 14 his or her vehicle to be used by another for the purpose of
 15 street racing or a street sideshow.
- 16 (b-5) A person may not knowingly interfere with or cause 17 the movement of traffic to slow or stop for the purpose of 18 facilitating street racing or a street sideshow.
- 19 (c) For the purposes of this Section:
- 20 "Acquiesce" or "permit" means actual knowledge that the 21 motor vehicle was to be used for the purpose of street racing.
- "Motor vehicle stunt" includes, but is not limited to, operating a vehicle in a manner that causes the vehicle to

slide or spin, driving within the proximity of a gathering of persons, performing maneuvers to demonstrate the performance capability of the motor vehicle, or maneuvering the vehicle in an attempt to elicit a reaction from a gathering of persons.

"Street racing" means:

- (1) The operation of 2 or more vehicles from a point side by side at accelerating speeds in a competitive attempt to outdistance each other; or
- (2) The operation of one or more vehicles over a common selected course, each starting at the same point, for the purpose of comparing the relative speeds or power of acceleration of such vehicle or vehicles within a certain distance or time limit; or
- (3) The use of one or more vehicles in an attempt to outgain or outdistance another vehicle; or
- (4) The use of one or more vehicles to prevent another vehicle from passing; or
- (5) The use of one or more vehicles to arrive at a given destination ahead of another vehicle or vehicles; or
- (6) The use of one or more vehicles to test the physical stamina or endurance of drivers over long-distance driving routes.

"Street sideshow" means an event in which one or more vehicles block or impede traffic on a street or highway, for the purpose of performing unauthorized motor vehicle stunts, motor vehicle speed contests, or motor vehicle exhibitions of

1 speed.

- 2 (d) Penalties.
 - (1) Any person who is convicted of a violation of subsection (a), (a-5), or (b-5) shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor for the first offense and shall be subject to a minimum fine of \$250. Any person convicted of a violation of subsection (a), (a-5), or (b-5) a second or subsequent time shall be guilty of a Class 4 felony and shall be subject to a minimum fine of \$500. The driver's license of any person convicted of subsection (a) or (a-5) shall be revoked in the manner provided by Section 6-205 of this Code.
 - (2) Any person who is convicted of a violation of subsection (b) shall be guilty of a Class B misdemeanor. Any person who is convicted of subsection (b) for a second or subsequent time shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
 - (3) Every person convicted of committing a violation of subsection (a) of this Section shall be guilty of aggravated street racing if the person, in committing a violation of subsection (a) was involved in a motor vehicle crash that resulted in great bodily harm or permanent disability or disfigurement to another, where the violation was a proximate cause of the injury. Aggravated street racing is a Class 4 felony for which the defendant, if sentenced to a term of imprisonment, shall

be sentenced to not less than one year nor more than 12 years.

(4) Every person convicted of engaging in a street sideshow in violation of subsection (a-5) of this Section shall be guilty of aggravated engaging in a street sideshow if the person, in committing a violation of subsection (a-5), was involved in a motor vehicle crash that resulted in great bodily harm or permanent disability or disfigurement to another, where the violation was a proximate cause of the injury. Aggravated engaging in a street sideshow is a Class 4 felony for which the defendant, if sentenced to a term of imprisonment, shall be sentenced to not less than one year nor more than 12 years.
