

## 103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 HB4831

Introduced 2/7/2024, by Rep. Kam Buckner

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Small Single-Use Plastic Act. Prohibits hotels from providing small, single-use plastic bottles containing personal care products, except upon request. Provides for a \$500 civil penalty after a first written warning. Provides for enforcement by the Attorney General, a State's Attorney, or a municipal attorney. Grants the Attorney General rule-making authority. Preempts home rule. Defines terms.

1 AN ACT concerning safety.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the Small
- 5 Single-Use Plastic Act.
- 6 Section 5. Definitions. As used in this Act:
- 7 "Hotel" has the same meaning ascribed to it in the Hotel
- 8 Operators' Occupation Tax Act.
- 9 "Personal care products" means a product intended to be
- 10 applied to or used on the human body in the shower, bath, or
- 11 any part thereof and shall include only shampoo, hair
- 12 conditioner, and bath soap.
- "Small, single-use plastic bottle" means a plastic bottle
- 14 or container with less than a 6-ounce capacity that is
- intended to be nonreusable by the end user
- Section 10. Small, single-use plastic bottles at hotels.
- 17 (a) Beginning July 1, 2025, a hotel with 50 rooms or more
- shall not provide small, single-use plastic bottles containing
- 19 personal care products in any space within a sleeping room
- 20 accommodation, within bathrooms shared by the public or
- 21 quests, or to a customer of the establishment staying in a
- 22 sleeping room accommodation.

- (b) Beginning January 1, 2026, a hotel shall not provide small, single-use plastic bottles containing personal care products in any space within a sleeping room accommodation, within bathrooms shared by the public or quests, or to a customer of the establishment staying in a sleeping room accommodation.
- (c) A hotel may provide personal care products in small, single-use plastic bottles to a person at no cost, upon request, at a place other than a sleeping room accommodation, a space within the sleeping room accommodation, or within bathrooms shared by the public or guests.
- (d) A unit of government, including a Home Rule unit, shall not pass an ordinance, resolution, or rule prohibiting a hotel from providing small, single use plastic bottles containing personal care products to customers. This Act is a denial and limitation of home rule powers and functions under subsection (q) of Section 6 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution.
- 19 Section 15. Civil penalties.
- (a) A hotel in violation of this Act shall receive a written warning for the first violation from the Office of the Attorney General, a State's Attorney, or a municipal attorney. The written warning shall recite the violation and advise that subsequent violations may result in citations and penalties. 25 Upon a second or subsequent violation, the hotel may be liable

- for a civil penalty of \$500 for each violation after an action under subsection (b).
- 3 (b) The Attorney General, a State's Attorney, or municipal 4 attorney may bring an action to request a civil penalty and a 5 court may impose a civil penalty under this Section against a 6 hotel violating this Act.
- 7 (c) The Attorney General shall adopt rules to implement 8 this Section, including rules establishing jurisdictional 9 authority over violations between the Attorney General, 10 State's Attorneys, and municipal attorneys.
