### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

735 ILCS 5/21-106 new

Amends the Code of Civil Procedure. Creates a process that Illinois residents may use to seek an Illinois judicial order making findings of fact to change a government-issued document from another state or country so that they may petition the issuing jurisdiction to change such a document.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Code of Civil Procedure is amended by 5 adding Section 21-106 as follows:

(735 ILCS 5/21-106 new)

7 Sec. 21-106. Legislative intent. Residents of this State who were born in another state or in another country may have 8 9 difficulty in securing government-issued documents with the correct information. It is the intent of the General Assembly 10 that Illinois should have a legal process available for these 11 12 residents to seek a judicial order making findings of fact so that they may petition the issuing jurisdiction to change such 13 14 a document.

(a) Process. An Illinois resident may file a petition in 15 16 his or her county of residence asking for a court to issue a 17 finding of fact or facts to correct or update a government-issued document from another state or country. As 18 19 used in this Section, "government-issued document" includes, but is not limited to, birth certificate, passport, driver's 20 21 license, or identification card. (b) The petition must contain the following information: 22

23 (1) petitioner's name and current address;
