## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

225 ILCS 110/8.5

Amends the Illinois Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology Practice Act. Makes changes in provisions concerning the educational requirements for licensure as a speech-language pathology assistant. Effective January 1, 2025.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Speech-Language Pathology and 5 Audiology Practice Act is amended by changing Section 8.5 as 6 follows:

7 (225 ILCS 110/8.5)

8 (Section scheduled to be repealed on January 1, 2028)

9 Sec. 8.5. Qualifications for licenses as a speech-language 10 pathology assistant. A person is qualified to be licensed as a 11 speech-language pathology assistant if that person has applied 12 in writing or electronically on forms prescribed by the 13 Department, has paid the required fees, and meets both of the 14 following criteria:

(1) Is of good moral character. In determining moral
character, the Department may take into consideration any
felony conviction or plea of guilty or nolo contendere of
the applicant, but such a conviction or plea shall not
operate automatically as a complete bar to licensure.

20 (2) Has received either (i) an associate degree from a 21 speech-language pathology assistant program that has been 22 approved by the Department and that meets the minimum 23 requirements set forth in Section  $8.6_{i\tau}$  (ii) a bachelor's - 2 - LRB103 37461 RTM 67583 b

degree and has completed course work from an accredited 1 2 college or university that meets the minimum requirements set forth in Section 8.6;  $\tau$  or (iii) a bachelor's degree in 3 speech-language pathology or communication sciences and 4 5 disorders from a regionally or nationally accredited institution approved by the Department that meets the 6 minimum requirements set forth in paragraph (2) of 7 subsection (a) in Section 8.6, and evidence of completion 8 9 of at least 100 hours of documented field work supervised 10 by a nationally certified and licensed speech-language 11 pathologist that is comparable to field work that 12 completed in a speech-language pathology assistant program 13 in this State, and completion of requirements for national certification as a speech-language pathology assistant. 14
