HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT HC0017

Introduced 1/17/2024, by Rep. Kevin Schmidt

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

ILCON Art. IV, Sec. 2.5 new

Proposes to amend the Legislature Article of the Illinois Constitution. Provides that a person may not be elected to the office of State Senator or State Representative for terms totaling more than 10 years in each house or a combined total of 20 years in both houses. Provides that service prior to the date of the adoption of the amendment shall be considered in the calculation of a person's service. Provides that any person in office at the time of the adoption of the amendment who exceeds the specified term limitation shall be allowed to complete his or her current term of office. Effective upon being declared adopted.

13	SECTION 2.5. TERM LIMITS
14	A person may not be elected to the office of State Senator
15	or State Representative for terms totaling more than 10 years
16	in each house or a combined total of 20 years in both houses.
17	Service prior to the date of the adoption of this amendment
18	shall be considered in the calculation of a person's service.
19	Any person in office at the time of the adoption of this
20	amendment who exceeds the specified term limitation shall be
21	allowed to complete his or her current term of office.
