The Community Behavioral Health Care 5 Professional Loan Repayment Program Act is amended by changing Sections 25 and 30 as follows: 6 7 (110 ILCS 996/25) 8 Sec. 25. Award; maximum loan time; maximum amount. Subject 9 to appropriation, the Commission shall award a grant to each 10 qualified applicant for a maximum of 4 years. The Commission must encourage the recipient of a grant awarded under this Act 11 12 to use the grant award for payments towards the recipient's 13 educational loans. The amount of the grant shall not exceed 14 (i) \$40,000 \$35,000 per year for a psychiatrist, (ii) \$20,000 15 \$15,000 per year for an advanced practice registered nurse or a physician assistant, (iii) \$20,000 \$12,000 per year for a 16

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1	psychologist who holds a doctoral degree, (iv) $\frac{$15,000}{$6,500}$
2	per year for a licensed clinical social worker $_{\it L}$ or a licensed
3	clinical professional counselor, or a licensed marriage and
4	<u>family therapist,</u> and (v) <u>\$4,000</u> \$2,500 per year for a
5	substance use professional, a certified alcohol and drug
6	counselor, or a certified recovery support specialist, (vi)
7	\$12,000 per year for a professional possessing a master's
8	degree in counseling, psychology, social work, or marriage and
9	family therapy, and (vii) \$6,000 per year for a professional
10	possessing a bachelor's degree in counseling, psychology, or
11	social work.
12	No less than 30% of the funding for grants under this
13	Section each fiscal year shall be reserved for awards to
14	minority applicants of African American or Black, Hispanic or
15	Latinx, Asian, or Native American origin. If the Commission
16	does not receive enough applications from qualified minorities
17	on or before January 1 of a given fiscal year to award 30% of
18	the funding to qualified minority applicants, then the
19	Commission may award a portion of these reserved funds to
20	other qualified applicants.

24 (a) To be eligible for assistance under the Community25 Behavioral Health Care Professional Loan Repayment Program,

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1 the Commission must find that the applicant satisfies all of 2 the following: 3 (1) He or she is a United States citizen or an eligible noncitizen. 4 5 (2) He or she is a resident of this State. (3) He or she has worked for at least 12 consecutive 6 7 months as a behavioral health professional in a community 8 mental health center, behavioral health clinic, substance 9 use treatment center, or State-operated psychiatric 10 hospital licensed or certified by the Department of Human 11 Services or the Department of Healthcare and Family 12 Services in an underserved or rural federally designated 13 Mental Health Professional Shortage Area in this State. 14 (4) He or she is a borrower with an outstanding

15 16 balance due on an educational loan. (5) He or she has not defaulted on an educational

17 loan.

(b) The Commission may grant preference to a previous recipient of a grant under the Program, provided that the recipient continues to meet the eligibility requirements under this Section.
