1 "Recreational camp" means any place set apart for recreational purposes for boys and girls. "Recreational camp" 2 shall not apply to private camps owned or leased for 3 individual or family use, or to any camp operated for a period 4 5 of less than 10 days in a year. (Source: P.A. 94-670, eff. 8-23-05.) 6 7 (410 ILCS 607/10) 8 Sec. 10. Possession, self-administration, and use of 9 epinephrine auto-injectors or inhalers at recreation camps and 10 after-school care programs. (a) A recreation camp or an after-school care program 11 12 shall permit a child with severe, potentially life-threatening 13 allergies to possess, self-administer, and use an epinephrine 14 auto-injector or inhaler, if the following conditions are 15 satisfied: 16 (1) The child has the written approval of his or her 17 parent or guardian. 18 (2) The recreational camp or after-school care program

19 administrator or, if a nurse is assigned to the camp <u>or</u> 20 <u>program</u>, the nurse shall receive copies of the written 21 approvals required under paragraph (1) of subsection (a) 22 of this Section.

(3) The child's parent or guardian shall submit
written verification confirming that the child has the
knowledge and skills to safely possess, self-administer,

1 and use an epinephrine auto-injector or inhaler in a camp or an after-school care program setting. 2 3 (b) The child's parent or guardian shall provide the camp 4 or program with the following information: 5 (1) the child's name; (2) the name, route, and dosage of medication; 6 7 (3)the frequency and time of medication 8 administration or assistance; 9 (4) the date of the order; 10 (5) a diagnosis and any other medical conditions medications, if not violation 11 requiring а of confidentiality or if not contrary to the request of the 12 13 parent or guardian to keep confidential; (6) specific recommendations for administration; 14 15 (7) any special side effects, contraindications, and 16 adverse reactions to be observed: 17 (8) the name of each required medication; and 18 (9) any severe adverse reactions that may occur to 19 another child, for whom the epinephrine auto-injector or 20 inhaler is not prescribed, should the other child receive a dose of the medication. 21 22 (c) If the conditions of this Act are satisfied, the child 23 may possess, self-administer, and use an epinephrine 24 auto-injector or inhaler at the camp or after-school care program or at any camp-sponsored or program-sponsored 25 26 activity, event, or program.

1 (d) The recreational camp or after-school care program must inform the parents or guardians of the child, in writing, 2 that the recreational camp or after-school care program and 3 4 its employees and agents are to incur no liability, as 5 applicable, except for willful and wanton conduct, as a result 6 any injury arising from the self-administration of of medication to the child. The parents or quardians of the child 7 8 must sign a statement acknowledging that the recreational camp 9 or after-school care program is to incur no liability, except 10 for willful and wanton conduct, as a result of any injury 11 arising from the self-administration of medication by the child and that the parents or guardians must indemnify and 12 13 hold harmless the recreational camp or after-school care 14 program and its employees and agents, as applicable, against 15 any claims, except a claim based on willful and wanton 16 conduct, arising out of the self-administration of medication 17 by the child.

18 (e) After-school care program personnel may administer an 19 undesignated epinephrine injection to any child if the 20 after-school care program personnel believe in good faith that 21 the child is having an anaphylactic reaction while in the 22 after-school care program. After-school care program personnel 23 may carry undesignated epinephrine injectors on their person 24 while in the after-school care program.

25 (f) After-school care program personnel may administer
26 undesignated asthma medication to any child if the

1 after-school care program personnel believe in good faith that 2 the child is experiencing respiratory distress while in the 3 after-school care program. After-school care program personnel 4 may carry undesignated asthma medication on their person while 5 in the after-school care program.

6 (q) If after-school care program personnel are to administer an undesignated epinephrine injection or an 7 undesignated asthma medication to a child, the after-school 8 9 care program personnel must inform the parents or guardians of 10 the child, in writing, that the after-school care program and 11 its employees and agents, acting in accordance with standard protocols and the prescription for the injection or 12 13 medication, shall incur no liability, except for willful and 14 wanton conduct, as a result of any injury arising from the 15 administration of the injection or medication, notwithstanding 16 whether authorization was given by the child's parents or quardians or by the child's physician, physician assistant, or 17 advanced practice registered nurse. A parent or guardian of 18 19 the child must sign a statement acknowledging that the 20 after-school care program and its employees and agents are to 21 incur no liability, except for willful and wanton conduct, as 22 a result of any injury arising from the administration of the medication or injection, regardless of whether authorization 23 24 was given by a parent or guardian of the child or by the 25 child's physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice 26 registered nurse, and that the parent or guardian must also

indemnify and hold harmless the after-school care program and its employees and agents against any claims, except a claim based on willful and wanton conduct, arising out of the administration of the medication or injection, regardless of whether authorization was given by the child's parent or guardian or by the child's physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse.

8 (h) If after-school care program personnel administer an 9 undesignated epinephrine injection to a person and the 10 after-school care program personnel believe in good faith the 11 person is having an anaphylactic reaction or administer 12 undesignated asthma medication to a person and believe in good 13 faith the person is experiencing respiratory distress, then 14 the after-school care program and its employees and agents, 15 acting in accordance with standard protocols and the 16 prescription for the injection or medication, shall not incur any liability or be subject to professional discipline, except 17 for willful and wanton conduct, as a result of any injury 18 19 arising from the use of the injection or medication, 20 notwithstanding whether notice was given to or authorization 21 was given by the child's parent or guardian or by the child's physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice 22 registered nurse and notwithstanding the absence of the 23 24 parent's or quardian's signed statement acknowledging release 25 from liability.
