

103RD GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2023 and 2024 SB0101

SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

215 ILCS 5/356z.25

Amends the Illinois Insurance Code. Provides that no group or individual policy of accident and health insurance or managed care plan shall deny or delay coverage for medically necessary treatment because the insured, enrollee, or beneficiary previously received any treatment, including the same or similar treatment, for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections or pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, or because the insured, enrollee, or beneficiary has been diagnosed with or receives treatment for an otherwise diagnosed condition. Provides that coverage of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome shall adhere to the treatment recommendations developed by a medical professional consortium convened for the purposes of researching, identifying, and publishing best practice standards for diagnosis and treatment of such disorders or syndrome that are accessible for medical professionals and are based on evidence of positive patient outcomes. Provides that coverage for any form of medically necessary treatment shall not be limited over a lifetime of an insured, enrollee, or beneficiary, unless the patient is no longer benefiting from the treatment, or by policy period. Provides that nothing in the provisions prevents insurers from requesting treatment notes and anticipated duration of treatment and outcomes. Effective immediately.

1 AN ACT concerning regulation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Insurance Code is amended by changing Section 356z.25 as follows:
- 6 (215 ILCS 5/356z.25)
- 7 Sec. 356z.25. Coverage for treatment of pediatric 8 autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with 9 streptococcal infections and pediatric acute neuropsychiatric syndrome. A group or individual policy of 10 11 accident and health insurance or managed care plan that is amended, delivered, issued, or renewed after July 18, 2017 12 (the effective date of Public Act 100-24) shall provide 13 14 for treatment of pediatric autoimmune coverage neuropsychiatric disorders associated with 15 streptococcal 16 infections and pediatric acute-onset neuropsychiatric 17 syndrome, including, but not limited to, the use of intravenous immunoglobulin therapy. 18
- No group or individual policy of accident and health
 insurance or managed care plan shall deny or delay coverage
 for medically necessary treatment under this Section solely
 because the insured, enrollee, or beneficiary previously
 received any treatment, including the same or similar

treatment, for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders
associated with streptococcal infections or pediatric acute
onset neuropsychiatric syndrome, or because the insured,
enrollee, or beneficiary has been diagnosed with or receives
treatment for an otherwise diagnosed condition.

For the purposes of this Section, coverage of pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome shall adhere to the treatment recommendations developed by a medical professional consortium convened for the purposes of researching, identifying, and publishing best practice standards for diagnosis and treatment of such disorders or syndrome that are accessible for medical professionals and are based on evidence of positive patient outcomes. Coverage for any form of medically necessary treatment shall not be limited over a lifetime of an insured, enrollee, or beneficiary, unless the patient is no longer benefiting from the treatment, or by policy period. Nothing in this Section prevents insurers from requesting treatment notes and anticipated duration of treatment and outcomes.

For billing and diagnosis purposes, pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome shall be coded as autoimmune encephalitis until the American Medical Association and the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services create and assign a specific code for pediatric

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autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome. Thereafter, pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome may be coded as autoimmune encephalitis, pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections, or pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome.

If, at any time, the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, or its successor agency, promulgates rules or regulations to be published in the Federal Register or publishes a comment in the Federal Register or issues an opinion, guidance, or other action that would require the State, pursuant to any provision of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public 111-148), including, but not limited to, 42 18031(d)(3)(B) or any successor provision, to defray the cost of any coverage for pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome outlined in this Section, then the requirement that an insurer cover pediatric autoimmune neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric syndrome is inoperative other than any such coverage authorized under Section 1902 of the Social Security

- 2 obligation for the cost of coverage for pediatric autoimmune
- 3 neuropsychiatric disorders associated with streptococcal
- 4 infections and pediatric acute onset neuropsychiatric
