Introduced 1/31/2023, by Sen. Dan McConchie

### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/6-115 from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-115 625 ILCS 5/6-118

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that, beginning no later than January 1, 2027, the Secretary of State shall offer to qualified applicants the option to be issued an 8-year driver's license at a cost of \$60. Provides that the Secretary shall submit proposed rules to implement the new provisions to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules no later than December 31, 2024. Makes corresponding changes.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 5 changing Sections 6-115 and 6-118 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/6-115) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-115)

7 Sec. 6-115. Expiration of driver's license.

(a) Except as provided elsewhere in this Section, every 8 9 driver's license issued under the provisions of this Code shall expire 4 years from the date of its issuance, or at such 10 later date, as the Secretary of State may by proper rule and 11 regulation designate, not to exceed 12 calendar months; in the 12 13 event that an applicant for renewal of a driver's license 14 fails to apply prior to the expiration date of the previous driver's license, the renewal driver's license shall expire 4 15 16 years from the expiration date of the previous driver's 17 license, or at such later date as the Secretary of State may by proper rule and regulation designate, not to exceed 12 18 19 calendar months.

The Secretary of State may, however, issue to a person not previously licensed as a driver in Illinois a driver's license which will expire not less than 4 years nor more than 5 years from date of issuance, except as provided elsewhere in this - 2 - LRB103 24937 HEP 51271 b

2 <u>(a-3) Beginning no later than January 1, 2027, the</u> 3 <u>Secretary shall offer to qualified applicants the option to be</u> 4 <u>issued an 8-year driver's license. The Secretary shall submit</u> 5 <u>proposed rules to implement this subsection to the Joint</u> 6 <u>Committee on Administrative Rules no later than December 31,</u> 7 <u>2024.</u>

8 (a-5) Every driver's license issued under this Code to an 9 applicant who is not a United States citizen or permanent 10 resident, or an individual who has an approved application for 11 asylum in the United States or has entered the United States in 12 refugee status, shall expire on whichever is the earlier date 13 of the following:

14 (1) as provided under subsection (a), (f), (g), or (i) 15 of this Section;

16 (2) on the date the applicant's authorized stay in the17 United States terminates; or

18 (3) if the applicant's authorized stay is indefinite 19 and the applicant is applying for a Limited Term REAL ID 20 compliant driver's license, one year from the date of 21 issuance of the license.

(a-10) Every REAL ID compliant driver's license issued under this Code to an applicant who is not a United States citizen or permanent resident, or an individual who has an approved application for asylum in the United States or has entered the United States in refugee status, shall be marked - 3 - LRB103 24937 HEP 51271 b

1 "Limited Term".

2 (b) Before the expiration of a driver's license, except those licenses expiring on the individual's 21st birthday, or 3 3 months after the individual's 21st birthday, the holder 4 5 thereof may apply for a renewal thereof, subject to all the provisions of Section 6-103, and the Secretary of State may 6 7 require an examination of the applicant. A licensee whose driver's license expires on his 21st birthday, or 3 months 8 9 after his 21st birthday, may not apply for a renewal of his 10 driving privileges until he reaches the age of 21.

(c) The Secretary of State shall, 30 days prior to the expiration of a driver's license, forward to each person whose license is to expire a notification of the expiration of said license which may be presented at the time of renewal of said license.

16 There may be included with such notification information 17 explaining the anatomical gift and Emergency Medical 18 Information Card provisions of Section 6-110. The format and 19 text of such information shall be prescribed by the Secretary.

There shall be included with such notification, for a period of 4 years beginning January 1, 2000 information regarding the Illinois Adoption Registry and Medical Information Exchange established in Section 18.1 of the Adoption Act.

(d) The Secretary may defer the expiration of the driver's
license of a licensee, spouse, and dependent children who are

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living with such licensee while on active duty, serving in the Armed Forces of the United States outside of the State of Illinois, and 120 days thereafter, upon such terms and conditions as the Secretary may prescribe.

5 (d-5) The Secretary may defer the expiration of the 6 driver's license of a licensee, or of a spouse or dependent 7 children living with the licensee, serving as a civilian 8 employee of the United States Armed Forces or the United 9 States Department of Defense, outside of the State of 10 Illinois, and 120 days thereafter, upon such terms and 11 conditions as the Secretary may prescribe.

12 (e) The Secretary of State may decline to process a 13 renewal of a driver's license of any person who has not paid 14 any fee or tax due under this Code and is not paid upon 15 reasonable notice and demand.

16 (f) The Secretary shall provide that each original or 17 renewal driver's license issued to a licensee under 21 years of age shall expire 3 months after the licensee's 21st 18 19 birthday. Persons whose current driver's licenses expire on 20 their 21st birthday on or after January 1, 1986 shall not renew their driver's license before their 21st birthday, and their 21 22 current driver's license will be extended for an additional 23 term of 3 months beyond their 21st birthday. Thereafter, the expiration and term of the driver's license shall be governed 24 25 by subsection (a) hereof.

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(g) The Secretary shall provide that each original or

renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 81 years of age 1 2 through age 86 shall expire 2 years from the date of issuance, 3 or at such later date as the Secretary may by rule and regulation designate, not to exceed an additional 12 calendar 4 5 months. The Secretary shall also provide that each original or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 87 years of age 6 7 or older shall expire 12 months from the date of issuance, or 8 at such later date as the Secretary may by rule and regulation 9 designate, not to exceed an additional 12 calendar months.

10 (h) The Secretary of State shall provide that each special 11 restricted driver's license issued under subsection (g) of 12 Section 6-113 of this Code shall expire 12 months from the date 13 of issuance. The Secretary shall adopt rules defining renewal 14 requirements.

(i) The Secretary of State shall provide that each driver's license issued to a person convicted of a sex offense as defined in Section 2 of the Sex Offender Registration Act shall expire 12 months from the date of issuance or at such date as the Secretary may by rule designate, not to exceed an additional 12 calendar months. The Secretary may adopt rules defining renewal requirements.

11 The fee for any duplicate license or permit shall be 12 waived for any person who presents the Secretary of State's 13 office with a police report showing that his license or permit 14 was stolen.

15 The fee for any duplicate license or permit shall be 16 waived for any person age 60 or older whose driver's license or 17 permit has been lost or stolen.

No additional fee shall be charged for a driver's license, or for a commercial driver's license, when issued to the holder of an instruction permit for the same classification or type of license who becomes eligible for such license.

The fee for a restricted driving permit under this subsection (a) shall be imposed annually until the expiration of the permit.

25 (a-5) The fee for a driver's record or data contained 26 therein is \$12.

3. \$6 of the original or renewal fee for a commercial driver's license and \$6 of the commercial learner's permit fee when the permit is issued to any person holding a valid Illinois driver's license, shall be paid into the CDLIS/AAMVAnet/NMVTIS Trust Fund.

4. \$30 of the \$70 fee for reinstatement of a license
suspended under the Family Financial Responsibility Law
shall be paid into the Family Responsibility Fund.

5. The \$5 fee for each original or renewal M or L
endorsement shall be deposited into the Cycle Rider Safety
Training Fund.

6. \$20 of any original or renewal fee for a commercial
 driver's license or commercial learner's permit shall be
 paid into the Motor Carrier Safety Inspection Fund.

7. The following amounts shall be paid into the

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General Revenue Fund:

(A) \$190 of the \$250 reinstatement fee for a summary suspension under Section 11-501.1 or a suspension under Section 11-501.9;

5 (B) \$40 of the \$70 reinstatement fee for any other 6 suspension provided in subsection (b) of this Section; 7 and

8 (C) \$440 of the \$500 reinstatement fee for a first 9 offense revocation and \$310 of the \$500 reinstatement 10 fee for a second or subsequent revocation.

11 8. Fees collected under paragraph (4) of subsection 12 (d) and subsection (h) of Section 6-205 of this Code; 13 subparagraph (C) of paragraph 3 of subsection (c) of 14 Section 6-206 of this Code; and paragraph (4) of 15 subsection (a) of Section 6-206.1 of this Code, shall be 16 paid into the funds set forth in those Sections.

(d) All of the proceeds of the additional fees imposed by
this amendatory Act of the 96th General Assembly shall be
deposited into the Capital Projects Fund.

(e) The additional fees imposed by this amendatory Act of
the 96th General Assembly shall become effective 90 days after
becoming law.

(f) As used in this Section, "active-duty member of the United States Armed Forces" means a member of the Armed Services or Reserve Forces of the United States or a member of the Illinois National Guard who is called to active duty

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- pursuant to an executive order of the President of the United States, an act of the Congress of the United States, or an order of the Governor.
